

After being kicked out of SLAUGH-TER, "Evil" Chuck reformed DEATH and will record an LP, probably for Combat Records.

with the delay in the release of SLAUGHTER's LP "Strappado" they decided to release a 7" promo single first.

Tommy left DESTRUCTION temporarily to join the army, being replaced by Witchhunter (ex-SODOM). The band recruited a second guitarist (photo).

KREATOR sacked their new guitarist Wulf again. According to Mille, he was too thin.

The band will probably play in North America soon.

French band HELLFIRE split up a while ago.

CELTIC FROST will change their direction to something more commercial (but DEF LEPPARD?!?!).



MEGADETH, whose LP should already be out, will be touring the U.S., and hopefully Europe, too. The band's fan club address is: MEGADETH, Dept. 808, P.O.Box 6010, SHERMAN OAKS, CA 91413, U.S.A. LEGACY will have their debut LP released soon on an independent label with major label distribution. I don't know who the new shouter is, since "Zetro" Sousa replaced Paul Bailoff in EXODUS.

A new recording label, Facemelt Records, has been started by Scott Givens. The first signing will be known soon.

L.S.N. have been confirmed to record the killer "Deadly Kiss" for the upcoming "Metal Massacre 8", which is scheduled for release in October. The vocals on "Deadly Kiss" will be done by Greg (?).

Argentinian HM magazine Riff Raff will be releasing a sampler with national bands soon.

The premier Brazilian HM magazine Rock Brigade is starting its own recording label, Rock Brigade Records. First release will be VULCANO.

Rumours say that Paul Bailoff will take over the vocals in HIRAX, after Katon DePena left the band.



MORBID ANGEL hails from Tampa, Florida, where it was formed in early 1984 by Trey Azagthoth (quitar), Mike Browning (drums, vocals), and Dallas Ward (bass). Soon after, Richard Brunelle (quitar) joined in, and the band began playing Florida's club scene. Johnny Ortega replaced Dallas Ward on bass in July of 1985.

This year the band signed a recording contract with the new label Goreque Records, and recorded their first LP, "Abominations Of Desolation". After it was ready, bassist Johnny Ortega was replaced by Sterling Scarborough from the band INCURUS.

MORBID ANGEL play death metal in a very original manner that puts them above the rest of the bands. Iheard four ad-

vanced tracks, which were enough to show me the band kills! "Hellspawn" blasts off with extreme speed in a style very similar to KREATOR, while "Angel Of Disease", "Chapel Of Ghouls", and "Abominations" have more moderated speeds and lots of rhythm changes, without losing any heaviness.

The LP was engineered by Bill Metoyer and will be distributed through Important, so everything is right for a great debut.

MASSACRE from Florida is the new band of the ex-DEATH members Kam Lee and Rick Rozz. It was formed about a year ago and its current line-up consists of Kam and Rick. Michael Borders (bass), and Billy Andrews (drums). There was a second guitarist before, but now Rick does all the guitars, and Kam the vocals (not the drums and the vocals like in DEATH anymore). They claim to be influenced by ME-GADETH, MOTORHEAD, CELTIC FROST, and SLAYER, but they've got their own style, which of course is very close to DEATH.

There's a 3-track studio demo of MASSACRE out, with an excellent sound quality. The first track, "Aggressive Tyrant", is thrashing speed with many rhythm changes. Kam's vocals being deeper than ever before. On his command ("thrash!!!") the ultra heavy bassdrum crossfire starts to annihilate my brain cells to get faster for a raging solo. "Death In Hell" starts appropriately with the funeral march, switching into the heaviest mid-tempo death metal. This track is really different from the old DEATH material. The last track is "Mutilated", a very fast one with some corpse grinding screams in the chorus. After hearing this tape, I (or what's left of me) can only tell you these guys kill!

A rehearsal tape which Michael sent me confirms that. "Traitor" is started by the bass, becoming another great fast DEATH metal track, with very original time changes in the middle. Heavy riffs are the beginning of "Infestation Of Death". Its rhythm is like POS-SESSED's "Evil Warriors", but it changes for the fastest section yet. After a sinister intro.

"Chamber Of Ages" starts pounding again, probably MASSACRE's greatest track. "Clangor Of War" is very similar to DEATH again, and "Perpetual Domination" shreds just like all the other tracks. The tape is finished with two old DEATH classics which are currently per-



formed by MASSACRE: "Corpsegrinder" and "Power Of Darkness", which is now called "Possessed By Darkness". Need I say anything about these tracks? MASSACRE have already contacted Combat Records and will hopefully release some vinyl soon, which I'm sure is gonna give them a high status within the underground. Their show will also contribute to that, because according to Michael it consists of "the mutilation of a wimp rocker in effigy, spreading a fire extinguisher on the audience, fire, blood, and some of the heaviest thrashing ever!" And how I believe this. All you thrashers and DEATH mani-

acs who were wondering where Rick and Kam were, send U.S.\$ 5 .- for the demo-tape or U.S.\$ 7.- for a 6-track live-tape to Michael Borders, and be mutilated by MASSAC-RE's death metal.

Are you ready for the ultimate death? Some more Bay Area thrashing talent has been unleashed upon the rest of the world. Going under the monicker of DEATH ANGEL, the band came into being at the end of 1982. Pinding their influences in EXODUS, METALLICA, FATE, and MAIDEN, the band has mastered the art of mixing the sound of the groups mentioned and by adding thair own delicate and personal touches they have put together a group that is simply killer. They have also stuck to their own Bay Area image of regular clothes and no special image. The band's members Rob Cavestany (guitar and vocals), Andy Galeon (drums), Gus Pepa (rhythm guitar), Dennis Pepa (bass and vocals), and Mark Osegueda (vocals) have been



playing the Bay Area for quite some time now and have built themselves a respectable following that are dedicated thrashers!! Live they are excellent and rather professional considering how young they are. It is almost scary to think how good they will be in a couple more years. Overall, the band is very unique, sounding a bit like EXODUS, VENOM, and the tempo changes of ME-TALLICA. Every time I see them, they are better than the time before. Their "Kill As One" demo-tape was re released a few months ago that contains killers like "Thrashers" and "Ultra Violence". Add to those titles such as "Devil's Metal", "Mistress Of Evil", and "Frolic Through The Park". Hopefully they will get signed to a

record label soon, because they are better than 99% of the thrash bands out there.

The mighty DEATH ANGEL have arrived.

DÉTENTE

Dawn Crosby: female hardcore throat

This is an interview with the first female thrash shouter, Dawn Crosby of DETENTE, which was done during her promotional trip to Europe. DETENTE is one of the heaviest new bands in L.A., which is shown on their first LP, "Recognize No Authority".

B.T.: Dawn, when was Détente formed?

Dawn: About a year and eight months ago by myself and drummer Dennis, and then we got exactly to this date about one year ago, Steve, the bass player, and Ross, the guitar player.

B.T.: Did you have any line-up changes until now sin-

ce the beginning of the band?

Dawn: Yes, since the beginning we changed everyone except the drummer and I, and exactly a year ago we got the new bass and two new guitar players, and we wrote this songs together for the new album, but the new album could be something new, it doesn't matter to us as long as the direction is accurate.

B.T.: Define the words thrasher and poser. What do

they mean for you?

Dawn: To me, a thrasher is someone who doesn't care about status or money, or making everything ckay. A thrasher is someone who is angry and likes to express himself. A poser is someone who thinks they're better than someone else, and they're wearing make-up, and they're fooling themselves, and they play music they think will make 'em a lot of money.

B.T.: What was the craziest situation that ever hap-

pened to you in a live show?

Dawn: After every show I've got bruises all over my body, 'cause of people flying through the air and knocking me over. They don't mean to do it in a bad way, they do it because they're going crazy. Also, during one show, these people from Dark Angel tried to take my shirt off. I was singing in the crowd really low, on the ground with 'em, and they pulled me into the crowd and tried to rip my shirt off, but luckily my friends were in the front, my friends from the Hollywood thrashers, and they beat 'em up, so I kept my shirt on. Coming back with half a shirt was really crazy.

B.T.: What do you think about fanzines?

Dawn: I think it's a fantastic form of communication for young people in the world. I think fanzines are into more intelligent music than the big, huge, money

-making magazines.

B.T.: Do you think you'll make it to Europe this summer?

Dawn: I definetely think so. I have a management company, the same as Agent Steel, and they're wanting to bring us over at the end of August and September. And it's always been my dream to tour in Europe. When I lived in London about two and a half years ago, I came to Europe to audition for bands. When it didn't work out I went back to the States thinking if only I could come back to Europe. And I think my dream is coming true this summer if the people like the album. B.T.: What are the bands you are listening to in your spare time?

Dawn: The Exploited, Sacrilege from the U.K., Sisters Of Mercy, Discharge, Voivod, I like also Exodus, Slayer, Metallica, Kreator and Destruction, a new band

L.S.N., and I think Legacy are quite good.

B.T.: How did you come up with such a rough voice?

Dawn: I think it came with the words I sing, you have to have a certain amount of anger in your voice. And also I have this studio where we practice, and this train running behind the studio, and I like to scream at the locomotive when it goes by. Also drinking.

B.T.: Give a statement to your new album.

Dawn: "Recognize No Authority", basicly its music is more metal, punk metal, thrash metal, but more metal. The vocals are more punk saying that you shouldn't accept what people give you. You should try and be what you want to be and say what you feel, and fuck anyone who tries to make you conform. "Recognize No Authority" means simply to not recognize a government, to not recognize the world leaders, to not recognize your teachers, to not recognize your parents, just live for yourself, because you never know how screwed up the other person is.

B.T.: You said you listened to bands like Exploited.

Do you think you're also influenced by them?

Dawn: Yeah, lyrically I think so. Some of the music is more metal, but then, the drumming is very punk. It's just a mixture. It's definetely different. It doesn't try to follow anyone else, it's a combination of different tastes coming into one, so it's hard to

describe.

B.T.: How many fans come to your gigs?

Dawn: It used to be very small, but now it's up to bout 500 to 2,000 in Los Angeles. San Francisco is not so strong yet, about from 500 to 1,000.

B.T.: How were the reactions to your demo-tape?

Dawn: Fantastic! We mailed out every two weeks 80 to 100 tapes. So for the last six months we've been mailing and mailing. Chile, Russia, Poland, of course Europe. Germany is the best, and Belgium, France, Holland, and the other Eastern Block countries. And the Eastern Block countries automatically get free albums and free tapes, because we know they can't buy it.

B.T.: Give a brief statement to you lyrics.

Dawn: As brief as I can be; "Holy War" is very political, "Russian Roulette", "Vultures In The Sky", the other ones are more esoteric. "It's Your Fate", "Shattered Illusions", "The Blood I Bleed", "Life Is Pain", songs looking at reality and being upset by it.

B.T.: Who writes the lyrics?

Dawn: I write all the lyrics, and I get my inspirations from life, from observing people, watching the news sometimes, and seeing the big leaders of the world, the arms rise. Also, my life has been very painful, I just write when I'm feeling pain. I'm not a happy person. No love songs! (laughs)

B.T.: Do you think the speed metal boom can exist for so long?

Dawn: If it evolves into something, if it evolves with the people, and these people are growing, and they're becoming more intelligent. If speed metal grows up with them, I think it will last. I think speed metal needs to go to another dimension. It needs to get away from satanic into more reality, because reality's gonna hit these people soon.

B.T.: Have you written new songs?

Dawn: Yes, I've written about four new songs for the next album, "My Battlefield", "The Frozen Son", it's very esoteric the new album, it's very secret feelings. You can think what you want and you read it, and maybe you can feel from your own life something's there. Also "No Trust", and the fourth track is not yet titled. But it's probably "Recognize No Authority".

B.T.: Turn ons, turn offs?

Dawn: I'm mainly turned on by people who are intelligent and have something to say. Also drinking with my friends, going insane with good bands playing, it's the best turn on, and sensitive men. Turn offs would be conservative cowboys, I hate 'em, disco, and meaningless A.O.R., and cleaning the house after one of my parties. They're very messy!

B.T.: Main goals for the future?

Dawn: To write another album, record it in Holland or Germany, and tour Europe, and feel they like us. But I never like to see too far ahead, 'cause you never know how long you're gonna be alive.

MORDRED is yet another superb powerthrash band from the Bay Area of Frisco. They've already done a couple of gigs, for example with POSSESSED, and have recorded a great demo. It was produced and engineered by Doug Piercy, and obviously has got a great sound. I think MORDRED's style is very similar to LEGACY, also a bit to MEGADETH, that means thrash with technical skill, power, and not just speed-for




-the-sake-of-speed (wasn't that an original description?). In other words, MORDRED's music is absolutely great. The demo has also got the most professional cover ever, including the lyrics, photo, hio, and great

The tape starts off with "Sever And Splice", which has a fast beginning and changes into a thrashing mid-tempo rhythm. The vocals are high, but angry and aggressive. "Mordred" is also not very fast, but heavy, and with great rhythm work. The chorus invites to shout. "The Chains Are Off But The Scars Remain" hasn't only got the longest title, it's the longest track on the tape, too. It's in the same rhythm, and I think it's surprising that five minutes without rhythm changes don't ever become boring. "Spellbound" has got some great speed changes, finishing the tape. I want to point out the excellent double lead guitar work all through the tape, which is in killer Bay Area fashion. MORDRED was already founded in 1984 by Alex Gerould (quitar) and Steve Scates (vocals). After a few months of gigging around, the band had a line-up change, with Alex, Steve, and bassist Art Liboon staying in the band, and Jim Sanguinetti (guitar) and Erik Lannon (drums) arriving. The band's current repertoire consists of fifteen songs, which range (and rage) from speedcore to melodic thrash. With this versatility, the band will get a major force in the underground, and it won't take them very long.

I always thought the total death could only come from San Francisco, but it seems that L.S.N. from L.A., "poser area" according to many Bay Area thrashers, are trying with all their violence to prove the contrary. L.S.N. is the abbreviation for LOUD SENSELESS NOISE, and that's what the band is nearly about, lethal speedcore thrash. Their 4-track demo is some of the most raging stuff I've heard lately. "Deadly Kiss", "Slaughterhouse", and "Raw Deal" are all little more than two minutes long, but that doesn't mean they're only stupid chainsawing. All of them are fast, with great pounding rhythm changes, deathly guitar leads, and vocals which are simply shredding. There's no use describing every track, because they're equally thrashing and killing. The demo ends with "Trapped", a seven second thrasher which completes the sonic torture. This God-like band was formed only a year ago by Greg Cekalo-

vich (guitar) and Mike Chacon (drums), both ex-VERMIN, who were joined soon after by vocalist Tony Vargas (ex-RAPE), the guy with the loud senseless voice (seriously, his vocals are ultra violent and totally of his own!). They started writing material and bassist George Robb (ex-AGENT STEEL) completed the band. Now they are already in contact with independent labels, so we can expect vinyl from 'em soon. Before it's out you

should write the band and buy the demo. The price is U.S.\$ 2.50 (U.S. & Canada) and U.S.\$ 3.00 (overseas), certainly not expensive!

ANNIHIAM

ANNIHILATION from Fremont, California, is a thrash metal group in the great Californian tradition, but it's not the typical hardcore band. They're heavy and often fast, including various rhythm changes, melodic parts, and an absolutely excellent guitar work. One of the reasons for their special style is surely the fact that the band members like almost every kind of music existing (I doubt they would like Argentinian pop!). The band was formed back in 1981 by Rob Spitzel (guitar) as a hardrock band under the name DEEP FREEZE. It went through the usual line-up and name changes, finally reaching its current line-up: Rob Spitzel, Jeff Stewart (guitar, vocals), Mark Tirado (drums), and Pat Saugar (bass), who called themselves ANNIHILATION.

Their '85 demo-tape, "Laugh At The Sight Of Pain", contains the tracks "Iron Cross", "Wizard In Black", "Beneath The Graves", and "Burning Deep Below", all of which have got heavy thrashing rhythms, a lot of intelligent time changes, and the rad lead and rhythm guitars of Jeff and Rob. The only problem with ANNIHILATION are Jeff's vocals, which in my opinion are totally unexpressive. But it seems like the band recognized this and therefore is looking for a lead vocalist "with good range and tone to voice, dedicated attitude, and good stage presence".





The band wants a singer more similar to the classic ones (Dio, Dickinson, Lips, John Oliva), and I agree that a melodic voice would fit their style, without affecting them as a thrash band. Interested vocalists should contact the band immediatly.

ANNIHILATION's future plans are releasing lots of vinyl (hopefully soon!), and doing live shows, which they have already done with bands from their area such as VIOLENCE, FORBIDDEN EVIL, REDRUM, etc.

Holy Terror

This one's a new speed metal band from L.A., which was formed by lead guitarist Kurt Kilfelt after recording and co-producing the LP "Skeptics Apocalypse" with AGENT STEEL. The rest of the line-up is Keith Deen (vocals) and Mike

Alvord (lead guitar), both ex-BLACK WIDOW, Floyd Flanary (bass), who had played with THRUST, and Jack Schwartz (drums), who's well known for his drum-thrashing on DARK ANGEL's LP "We Have Arrived". The band sent me a demo-tape which shows their style is melodic thrash metal. It starts with a strange but well done intro called "Blessed Sacrament". Immediatly after it there's "Black Plague", a fast thrashing track with a great double lead. The sound is really excellent, one thing that's missing on most demos. Following track, "Distant Calling", is absolutely different from the first one. It's mid-paced and melodic, even a bit reminiscent of MATDEN, but heavy, though. "Guardians Of The Netherworld" is in a similar vein, accelerating at the end for another great solo. Briefly said, a very good demo, which could've been even better with more aggression thrown in. The band is announcing the release of an LP with the

demo tracks plus others like "Lake Of Fire", "Mortal Fear", etc. (neither labels nor names are given), and a tour. The demo (U.S.\$ 4.-) and T-shirts (U.S.\$ 8.-) are available at:

In our last issue we presented CRYPTIC SLAUGHTER, one of the most radical (music-wise) bands the Califormian scene has ever put out. With the release of their debut LP we thought it was time to do an interview with guitarist Les Evans.

B.T.: What can you say about your debut LP? Les: We're really happy with how it turned out, it really represents our current sound and it totally kills the demo. It will be released in July and is 'called "Convicted".



B.T.: How has your work with Metal Blade Records been?

Les: Good so far, we don't talk to them a lot. We let our lawyer (Bill's father) take care of the legal bullshit.

B.T.: What do you think about the "Metal Massacre 7"? Les: I think it totally sucks. I hate it.

B.T.: How did Cryptic Slaughter form?

Les: We met through friends and got along well enough to start playing together on a regular basis.

B.T.: Which bands influenced you?

Les: Suicidal, Minor Threat, Hirax, etc.

B.T.: How are your shows at the Bay Area?
Les: Well, we live about 400 miles away from the Bay Area so we've played only one show up there, but the people there are really crazy. We're gonna tour up to S.F. again this summer.

B.T.: Which is your favorite poser torment method? Les: I stay away from posers.

A lot has been written and said about METALLICA's ex-guitarist Dave Mustaine, but people seem to forget the first axeman which they had, Lloyd Grant, who actually played that lead on the cut "Hit The Lights" for the first "Metal Massacre". Since early 1983 Lloyd has been working on DEFCON, which wasn't complete until 1986. DEFCON is Steve Hallas (bass), Patrick Scott (guitar), Doug Clawson (drums), Steve Williams (vocals), and Lloyd Grant (lead guitar). There's a 5track demo of the band available, with a really great production. Most of the tracks are fast and heavy, with outstanding guitar work. The vocals of Steve Williams are often very high-pitched, and one must really get used to them, but then tracks like "Red Light" or "Sniper" sound really excellent.

SYRANAX's bio mays it is a band "formed out of bore-dom" in the dead Austin metal scene. After hearing their demo I have to say it doesn't sound as if bore-dom was their main inspiration, because it's a great thrashing piece of metal.

The band was formed little more than a year ago by Sean Ross (bass) and Rick Lane (lead guitar, vocals), who were joined shortly after by Jamie Overcarik (lead guitar) and Ricky Colley (drums). They kept rehearsing and writing originals in the months to follow, not wanting to be known until they were ready for it. They didn't want to put out a shitty noise demo, which is a great attitude in my opinion! They finally recorded a 4-track studio demo called "The Battalion Of Death", which they unleashed on the unsuspecting thrash underground. The four tracks thrash like hell, but have enough technicality and originality to set SYRANAX apart from the bunch of noise death metal bands which fill the scene today. Rick's voice is the band's trademark, because he doesn't sound like all other vocalists do, his singing is more in the vein of Gary St. Pierre (ex-HAWAII), with some high screams. He still has to work his vocals out a bit to use his range in a more powerful and aggressive way, but the songs on the demo are great anyway.

The band has played a lot live already, being liked by metal crowds as well as hardcore crowds in Texas. They plan to release a self-financed single soon, and are starting to promote themselves more strongly. A Canadian thresh band which has already gained much recognition from the underground media is AGGRESSION, and they really deserve it. The band is very influenced by SLAYER, and you notice that immediatly when listening to their great demo-tape, which includes four killer tunes. It starts off with "Blaspheming At The Altar" at blazing speed, the vocals sounding a bit Tom Araya influenced, and the instrumental work being totally heavy (great sound, too!). "Evil Pox" is the slowest track on



the tape, speeding up for a great lead, fuckin' heavy track! "Metal Slaughter" and "Torment Or Death" are both fast, the latter one being my fave on the tape.

The line-up in AGGRESSION has been the same for about 9 months, with Butcher (lead vocals), Death (guitar), Burn (guitar), Dug (bass), and Gate (drums). They have done a couple of gigs in their crea, and are getting airplay on the most important metal radio stations such as WBCR, as well as being promoted through many underground mags. Hopefully it won't take 'em very long to get a record deal. In fact, guess who published some of their tracks on samplers? You're right, New Renaissance Records. I got a tape and a biography written in German from the promoters in Switzerland. This bio is really funny, for example calling KØTSEN's style "elastic freestyle boogie" and talking about their talent, charisma, professionalism, etc.. Actually, the only concrete information I've got is that the band was founded in October of 1982 in Iceland (?), and that the line—up is: Ulf Eriksson (vocals), Leif Lundkvist (guitar), Ole Eriksson (bass), Erik Holmkvist (drums).

About the demo "Attack Of The Savage Horde", there's not a lot to be said. It's just noise, which even differences KØTSEN from some thrashable death or punk noise bands, because at times it doesn't even have a constant rhythm (zum Kotzen!).


I'd really dare wondering whether it is an untalented band from Iceland or just a joke from those guys in Switzerland, fooling the whole metal scene, and us, too!

Now that the second nuclear warhead of VOIVOD has exploded upon our heads, it's time to know what has happened within the icy realms of Morgoth land in the last months.

As you all now, VOIVOD had lots of trouble in getting a proper recording deal. The contract they had with Metal Blade gave them an option to do their second LP on that label, too, but the deal offered by Brian Slagel was unacceptable to them, since they were the second best selling band on Metal Blade Records, right after SLAYER.

They got in contact with Attic / Viper (Canada), Roadrunner (Holland), Important / Combat (U.S.), and Noise Records (Germany), and finally decided that Noise gave them the best conditions. The LP "Rrröooa-aarrr", which was recorded in October and November of 1985 while the band was without a contract, and was made available through the Iron Gang Fan Club as a rough mix, was released in June of this year, and is distributed in the U.S. by Combat, and in Canada by Banzai Records.

But before that happened VOIVOD were very active, doing a tour of highschools in Quebec and playing on the famous "World War III" festival in Montreal with DESTRUCTION, CELTIC FROST, POSSESSED, and NASTY SAVA-GE. In April they played in New York for the first time, on the same hill as the CRO MAGS and VENOM. Now they're just back from their first U.S. tour, which they did together with label mates CELTIC FROST and RUNNING WILD (wouldn't KREATOR have been the right Noise band for this package?). This tour led them through more than 15 states, and I'm sure it helped establishing VOIVOD as the major underground force they deserve to be.

For the rest of this year they have planned to go to Germany to record their third LP, as well as doing some gigs there, plus some others in France, England, and surely Holland.

In our next issue we will have an interview with VOI-VOD, with the band's thoughts about the tour, the LP, and everything else.


The first track, "Witchcraft", shows immediatly that also Killjoy's voice sounds a bit different now, not that dark anymore.

WEHRMACHT

WEHRMACHT (no Nazis!) is a band from Portland, Oregon, which deserves the title of the fastest band around. Yep, faster than SODOM, HI-RAX, and anyone else; let's see how long that lasts. Those of you readers who still have a brain will probably ask yourselves what's the sense of doing that. The band will surely agree with me that there is no sense, but that isn't what they want anyway. Their goals, according to drummer Brian Lehfeldt, are "to become one of the fastest, funest, and wildest bands". They don't play any special style, just fast and savage hardcore influenced by gods like D.R.I., ACCUSED, SLAYER, POSSESSED, SEPTIC DEATH, and DESTRUCTION, and write lyrics about "cool stuff like: beer, sharks, big tits, extremely fast music, and sick movies", and stuff that sucks to them, "like: rednecks, war, Miami Vice clones, posers, the draft, virgins, and when the keg is dry!" Lightning speed thrashers and punks should write the band immediatly, 'cause they have lots of tapes available (I've got their "Beermacht" demo, which kills), and they should be on a 7" compilation with NECROPHAGIA and two other bands. Just to finish, this is their line-up: Tito Matos (vocals), John Duffy (guitar), Mark Zo-

It's a sad thing what the hardcore movement is becoming. Most of the bands coming out just play fast death noise, with the few ideas they have taken from the band which came out before. HATRED is not just more of the same. Of course they play hyper fast, but they did a very well recorded demo, and their vocalist Mike "Guts" Depoy is one of the most deathly original thrash vocalists I know. His voice sounds as corrosive as if he had acid in the throat! The vocals he spews out deal with such deep concepts as "disgust, violen-

ce, degradation, nausea, gore, death, and sick, demented, painful torture!" That can be noticed from the title and cover art of their demo "Drowning In Afterbirth", which also has got the right intro: It starts with the sound of someone pissing. The following are seven of the sickest tracks I've heard yet. Fast almost all the time, only changing for some heavy pounding now and then, they are 15 minutes of total savagery. My fave track is the opener "Summon The Dead", but the other ones like "Gore", "Festering Puke", or "Bloody Guts" (yum, yum!), are also ripping and disgusting to make you throw up in extasy. The band history was probably too gorey, because Mike did not send me a bio, but I know their line-up at least: Mike Depoy (vomit vocals), Jerry Dalessandro (violent guitar slaughter), Jay McChesney (skin pounding mayhem), and Damage (nuclear bass assault).

This chaotic New Jersey deathcore band has become fairly well-known in the underground already. Unite!

I think there has never been a better moment in the existance of Blowing Thrash to write a comment about the almost faded thrash scene in Chile. I say this because the hardcore movement is in great trouble, and it's now when all of this movement's members must unite. Unfortunately this hasn't happened and the solution to this problem becomes darker every time.

These are the moments when you see who are the true thrashers and who are calling themselves thrashers. But this isn't the only problem, there's another one that is also very important:

The mass media have been in charge of putting the idea into the people's heads that thrash (Ed.: And I think normal HM. too.) is a music that is only listened by satanists. Any other person that listens to this kind of music would be comitting an evil act. I have always said fools exist everywhere, and Chile is no exception (Ed.: Definetely!). These guys are following the sacred message of the mass media, and I have never seen them again. Another thing that harms our loved underground movement is the little attendance to thrash gigs, which makes them really seldom. But this small attendance is balanced with the brutality inside them, where violence and aggressions are absolutely normal. (Ed.: But I think unfortunately "violence" is becoming more important than the music, and that won't allow neither a growing and maturing of thrash metal, nor more people joining the movement.) In closing, I think that the only way the Chilean thrash scene can grow is the union of all its members to work together for strengthening the hardcore movement in our country.

YATCH FUEK

This four-piece band from Austin, Texas, is one that has really impressed me. Jason McMaster (vocals), Doug Keyser (bass), Billy White (guitar), and Rick Colaluca (drums) have been together for over four years now, and have released their debut-LP "Energetic Disassembly" on a totally unknown label (Zombo Records) just some months ago. This LP is surely the most complex and technical work that has ever been done in underground metal. Their music, with influences such as RUSH, jazz fusion, and hardcore, is aggressive as well as intelligent, ranging from speed to such excentric parts as bass solos. Every instrument is played as if it would lead, and the vocals give it thrash's very own anger. But I would hesitate to call WATCH TOWER's style thrash or hardcore. I think they have taken elements from various types of music, creating something absolutely new.

Their vocals deal with current, historical events and subjects of social importance, but not in the typical "no future" fashion, they really have something to say. Good examples are "Meltdown", which is about a nuclear accident (prophetic, considering it was written before Chernobyl), or "Tyrants In Distress", which is about a revolution, and, besides, my favorite track.

If you're not into death metal exclusively, then you should really get this great LP. I've heard it will be released in Europe by Noise (these guys are doing things right!), otherwise you can get it directly from the band, as well as other merchandise: LP.....U.S.\$ 8.00

While ANTHRAX were on their first European tour, our contributor Bart Kamp had a long talk with Scott Ian. They touched on many subjects (mainly pissing Neil Turbin off) until reaching the S.O.D. project. This experimental fun band formed by Billy Milano (ME-THOD OF DESTRUCTION) on vocals, Charlie Benante (ANTHRAX) on drums, Dan Lilker (NUCLEAR AS-SAULT) on bass, and Scott Ian on guitar, released one of the most ripping hardcore LPs ever, "Speak English Or Die".

B.T.: "Speak English Or Die" is meant to make fun about bands who play so extremely fast ... Scott Ian: Yeah, hopefully clean out. All of these death metal bands who are terrible will hopefully listen to this album and say "I quit!", and put the guitars away and go working as a counter, and not playing anymore. We were hoping maybe that would stop people, but actually I think it had the reverse effect, people hearing that album would say "Hey, let's form a band like S.O.D.!". I quess if that's what we were set out to do we didn't do what we were supposed to do.

B.T.: You called Danny Lilker

again. Why?

S.I.: Well, 'cause I just knew he would be right. He was perfect. When we were writing that S.O.D. stuff while we were in the studio with Anthrex, I didn't want to be just like Anthrax as S.O.D., it would have been like two Anthrax albums. Originally Frankie was gonna play bass on it. Frankie was like the original bass player up to almost the last minute. He said "If you want it, have Danny doing it", and so tying up the relationship again between us and Danny. So I called him up and told him about the project. He had seen what was going on so he came up to the studio and we wrote most of the whole album in three days and recorded it in three days. The time was right. I really don't know how we did it, the way how wrote everything so quick and did it, I mean everything was so perfect, we couldn't have had a better time.

B.T.: The person Seargent D. is not very known in Europe. Can you tell me something about it? S.I.: It was just a cartoon that Charlie and me came up with when we were in the studio with An-

thrax. We were just doing pictures and putting 'em on the wall, and writing "Speak English or die" on it, and that's how it came about, it's just a cartoon guy, before we even wrote any songs or had any idea of making a band out of it. Everybody thought it was so funny, a skull as an army guy with this gun on, like the totally proud American, you know, "America, Ame rica!". It's supposed to be funny, and it was funny, all those pictures all over the place. B.T.: What's the point of making songs of four and five seconds? S.I.: There's no point at all. It's just funny, we just like to do it. That's all you have to say, so why spend three minutes on it if you can do it like that. The first one we actually did was "Diamonds And Rust", which we actually stole from Judas Priest, because if you listen to the "Unleashed In The East" album, the way he announces it is like "Dia monds... And Rust!!!". Wouldn't it be funny if that was a whole song? That was the first one we did and then we came up with the other ones. We've got so much of 'em now. We played with Overkill from New York once, and after us doing all our songs they get on stage and said "This one goes out to S.O.D.", and they did the song "Green Manalishi", but they did it just like "Green ... Manalishi!!!". B.T.: What do you think of people who consider S.O.D. a fascist band?

S.I.: That's wholly wrong. We have different opinions also in S.O.D., like me, Charlie, and Danny pretty much are one, but Billy, who happens to be a New York skin, and he's been a skin since 1979, every thing he says on that album he truthfully believes. I mean Billy is a fascist, and Billy is a racist, and Billy hates everybody. As a band we get along, but otherwide we're just screaming at each other all the time. He's a great guy, I mean he's a nice guy when he wants to be, but he can also be an ass, 'cause he's big, and he's strong, and he's loud, and he's obnoxious, and he's arrogant. He'd start a fight with somebody if he looks him in the wrong way. He doesn't care if he gets arrested, and he'll punch the policeman in the face, and he doesn't care if he goes to jail for the rest of his life. And he wouldn't care if he got killed today 'cause life



sucks, and this planet sucks, and that is Billy's attitude. People can take it like they want. "Speak English" is about people who're holding a position where they have to communicate with people every day, and they can't even speak English. In New York, it's really getting kinda bad in that city, it's like all the Middle Eastern countries take the people out of their jails and send 'em to New York. Like Cuba did to Florida, emptied their fails and sent all their criminals to Florida, that's what it's like. They sent a ton of lowlife.

B.T.: I read that you guys are gonna switch instruments on your next album for one song.

S.I.: On "United Forces" on the record I play the guitar, the rhythm, but Charlie actually plays that lead at the end. Live, when we play it, I play drums and Charlie plays guitar for the whole song, 'cause I can play his drum set, you know, nothing special, but I can do that song, and Charlie's really an amazing guitar player. If we do another record, on one song we'll also switch, 'cause Billy's a bass player, we'll have Danny sing, and I'll play drums, and Charlie'll play guitar. Quite confusing, something like that.

Scott ended up saying that although there are already 30 new S.O.D. tracks it would be really difficult to bring the band together for another album, mainly due to the success he's having with ANTHRAX.

B.T.: Why did Eric Eycke leave the band?

Woody: Musical differences with us I suppose... He drank a lot as well.

B.T.: Who writes the songs in C.O.C.?

B.T.: Are you gonna stay as a three-piece?
Woody: No! C.O.C. now has a fourth member, a singer.
His name is Simon Bob. He used to sing for Ugly Americans.

B.T.: What does the future bring for the band? Woody: Another album and a big tour coming up.

D.R.I. (DIRTY ROTTEN IMBECILES) hail from San Francisco, California, and have been together in one form or another for five years. The current line-up is Spike on guitar, Felix on drums, Josh on bass, and Kurt on vocals. At the moment the band are on what is most likely their biggest but definetely their most successful tour of the U.S. and Canada. During a lay-over in Raleigh, North Carolina, I got a chance to interview them before we all got drunk to remember any of what we were talking about.

B.T.: When will the new album come out?

Spike: It will be out in late summer or by the end of the year pending our time schedule. We keep getting more dates to play so we don't get time to record. We have two songs written which will be on the new Death Records compilation album. They are "Five Year Plan" and "Fun And Games".

B.T.: Will the next album be on Death?

Spike: Yes, Death has been really good to us. They pay recording and all kinds of other stuff. They even loaned us \$5,600 when we needed it to fix the truck. They get the record into stores everywhere!

B.T.: Where is this tour taking you?

Spike: All over the whole U.S. and Canada. We are



playing in every state except Alaska and Hawaii.

B.T.: Do you hope to tour Europe?

Spike: We don't want to go to Europe unless we can get contracted. We can't afford to pay to go over but if someone will contract us then we will be glad to go.

B.T.: What do you think about metallers getting into hardcore?

Felix: Great!!! Dave Mustaine changed it a lot, what he wrote for Metallica really did it. I want to ask if they have chili on chili dogs in Chile and I want everybody to write and tell me if they do!!

B.T.: Do you like playing metal clubs?

<u>Felix</u>: Yes, L'Amour sucks because you have to put up with the bouncers. I got thrown down and kicked by the bouncers and Josh got his stage pass torn up.

B.T.: Where do you get mail from?

Spike: We get it from all over! A lot from Australia, Japan, and tons from the U.S. and Canada. Now we hope to get some from Chile!!!!

B.T.: Is there anything you would like to say to your Chilean supporters.

Spike: If you can get a promoter down there to supply us with round trip tickets, the equipment we can't bring with us and a place to stay then we wil play in Chile for free! We will do this anywhere in the world as well but definetely in Chile.

Felix: Push your promoters to get us down there!!!!!

Josh: I'm too drunk to say anything.

BLOODFEAST is one of the many new death metal bands from the New York area. The band was formed as a four-piece in early 1985 under the name BLOODLUST, the line-up being Gary Markovitch (vocals), Adam Tranquilli (guitar), Lou Starita (bass), and Kevin Kuzma (drums). They claim to be influenced by SLA-YER, OVERKILL, EXODUS, D.R.I., C.O.C., S.O.D., etc., but they don't follow any special direction, just simple hardcore metal, but ripping!

They have recorded a four-track studio demo called "Suicidal Mission", which is really heavy. It starts off with "Menacing Thunder", a fast track that shows

some great guitar work, pretty violent vocals, and killer double bassdrumming by Kevin. The style lacks originality, but it thrashes anyway. "The Evil" isn't that fast, but very heavy, too. Next track, "Bloodlust", speeds up again, with rhythm changes that pound the shit out of you. Last track is "Suicidal Mission", also a fast one, but I don't like it as much as the others.

In early February of this year Mike Basden joined BLOODLUST as a second guitarist, which will give the band an even heavier sound. They changed their name to BLOODFEAST a while ago to avoid confusions with the L.A. BLOODLUST. The "Suicidal Mission" demo isn't available anymore, but don't cry, there will be an LP of BLOODFEAST out on N.R.R. very soon.

VISIBLE MINORITY was formerly called HAGGATH, and it's an ultra heavy thrash punk band from the Toronto area. I got a tape with half an hour of rehearsals and it really rips. Most of the bands they like are punk, like D.R.I., RAW POWER, 7 SECONDS, and MINOR THREAT, and their lyrics are also very punk, but I think they will appeal to lots of thrashers because of their heaviness (and fun!). Darren McKay (bass), Rino (guitar), Vince Capobianco (drums), Paul Capobianco (vocals), and Mike Prokic (guitar) will hopefully release a demo soon, so we can admire how they sound well-recorded. Try to get some of their stuff, 'cause songs like "Corpse In My Bed" will cause you an intensive shock.

SUDDEN IMPACT

"Toronto rules the world now! In a year it will be the new hot spot." These are words of Terry Sadler, bassist and vocalist of SLAUGHTER. And it really looks like the Toronto thrash scene would be growing. Proof of it is SUDDEN IMPACT, a hardcore band formed in 1984. The current line-up is Reid English (quitar), Stephen Milo (bass), Mitch Garvin (vocals), Scott Fraser (drums), and Michael Brunt (quitar). They recorded a demo which was very well ree ceived, and did some guest appearances with punk acts like SUICIDAL TENDENCIES, SCUM, and others. Not long ago they recorded their debut LP, "No Rest From The Wicked", for Fringe Records. I only know four tracks from it and don't have their titles, but I can say they're crossover thrash along the lines of C.O.C. and D.R.I., simply great! The songs are mostly speed, but with pounding rhythm changes and typical punk vocals.

The Canadian death metal band VOOR, from Jonquiére, Quebec, is very popular among the tape trading underground thrashers.

VOOR was formed as a five-piece in October of 1984 playing covers, but very soon wrote their first original, the classic "Creature Of War". It ended up being a four-piece, with Erol (drums), Martin (vocals), Steeve (bass), and Sylvain (guitar), who are influenced by the likes of SLAYER, DISCHARGE, etc.. They have two "Evil Metal" demos out. The first one contained "Evil Metal", "In The Hell", "Creature Of War", "No Title" (definetely the most original title ever), and a cover of VENOM's "Bloodlust". The riffing is simple, but deadly, and the vocals are deeply black, a thrashin' and bangin' orgy. The second demo, a four track recorded in September of 1985, has a better sound on it, but does only include one new song, "Like A Snake", along with three killers from the first demo. Not long ago Erol quit the band, so they'll have to interrupt their activities until a new member is found. I don't have any more info about this great group, I can only give you their address so you can write and ask anything you want. Both demos are available for U.S.\$ 3.- each, plus \$ 2.- for p/p.

The rapidly awakening scene of New York is giving us one thrash band after another. SAVAGE THRUST is one of the best ones. Formed in 1984 on Staten Island, the initial purpose of playing covers didn't last very long. The band decided they'd better play their own material, which is really good. Their influences range from the Mahavishnu Orchestra to EXODUS, so that's not a good point of comparison at all. "Crown Of Thorns" opens their "Demo Of Doom", a double bassdrum speed thrasher with a heavy time change and the versatile vocals of Michael Smith, who has got a really wide range and powerful style. Edmund Varuolo and Pat Donofrio do a great guitarwork, rhythm as well as lead, and the rhythm section of Bob Boch (drums) and Jim Gellentien (bass) is precise and heavy. Following track, "Mistress Of The Night" is a lot slower, and sounds more like NASTY SAVAGE, very good, too. "The Damage Is Done" is fast and original in the vocal lines, and the last track, "Assassin", is somewhat like NASTY SAVAGE again, with very heavy instrumental work in the rhythm changes. The band is trying to get some vinyl released, but of course they'll first be featured on

N.R.R.'s compilations. They've been active in the N.Y. circuit, supporting acts like EXODUS and ANTHRAX, and I can imagine that live the songs from the demo rage! Write them (there's a fansing from the band available) at:

This is, at the moment, the heaviest band in South America. SE-PULTURA (= grave) was formed in 1984, consisting today of Max (guitar, vocals), Igor (drums), Tormentor (lead guitar), and Destructor (bass). Though they had a hard beginning, they managed to get a recording deal with Cogumelo Records, who released their EP "Bestial Devastation" together with OVERDOSE's (see article) in December of 1985. "Bestial Devastation" contains four brutally heavy tracks, which are above a whole lot of U.S. and European death metal bands. "Bestial Devastation", "Antichrist", "Necromancer", and "Warriors Of Death" are mainly fast, without too technical parts, but with the necessary amount of original riffs and rhythms. Only the lead guitar work should be better, but the band is still in a phase of developing their style. Considering their average age of 16 (!!!) I think they won't have any problem in becoming leaders in the S.A. underground as well as an important band worldwide.

I held a short interview with bandleader Max.

B.T.: What can you say about your next LP?

Max: Our next LP will be called "Morbid Visions". It will be 8 songs, one being instrumental. It will be much better recorded; our first one was recorded only on eight tracks, and the songs are all on a higher level, they're faster and heavier. We've got a better production work, so we will sound much bigger on this LP. Late August we started recording, we recorded one week in Sao Paulo, and the album should be out in October.

B.T.: Which are the new songs?

Max: The new songs are "Morbid Visions", "Mayhem", "Crucifixion", "Funeral Rites", "Troops Of Doom", "War", "Show Me The
Wrath", and "Empire Of The Damned".

B.T.: How are the shows in Brazil?

Max: There aren't many shows here in Brazil, because of the lack of money, and because people here don't support HM, and even less black metal and thrash metal, which is really difficult to do here. It's also very hard to find a place for a show, because the owners think people will destroy everything. But when there is a show it's really good, because the Brazilian audience is a very lively audience, and that helps a lot to play thrash metal.

B.T.: Which Brazilian bands do you like?

Max: I like Dorsal Atlantica, which for me is the best, Mutilator, which I like a lot, Chakal, Vulcano, Anthares, etc.

B.T.: How do you see the thrash scene of South America?

Max: Well, I think South America should promote more its metal.

It's already time for the South American bands to start showing they have potential like those from Germany, Denmark,... I've received letters from people from the U.S.A. interested in what is going on in Brazil, and I think for Argentina and Chile, too.

B.T.: Is there any possibility for you to play outside Brazil?

Max: We want to go as soon as possible, because the more promotion we get, the better. We have a project to go to Canada or U.S.A., we are studying which city. We are also thinking of doing a tour which should include four of Brazil's states we haven't played yet. We'd also like to arrange something with you in Blowing Thrash to play in Chile. For us it would be great!

Brazil has got the strongest metal underground in South America, with several powerthrash bands releasing vinyl and a really big scene. VULCANO from Santos, a city in the state of Sao Paulo, is the black metal band (that's how they call their style) which draws the largest crowds at their gigs. The band was formed out of the remnants of ASTHAROT and SATANIC, and started playing under their current name in 1981, led by bassist Zhema. A 7" single was released, which isn't available today, and the band went through various line


-up changes until reaching the definitive line-up in 1985, consisting of Zhema (bass), Angel (70cals), Flavio (quitar), Soto Junior (guitar), and Laudir Piloni (drums). According to their band bio, VULCANO gained popularity touring their state, and finally decided to release a self-produced live LP, recorded at the city of Americana. On this LP, which lacks a good production, VULCANO shows a style which consists of simple riffing, switching between fast and slow parts, with a pretty deathly voice. I have to say I think this LP is weak, mainly because of the poor sound, but also because the style shown wasn't matured enough. Anyway, the album sold out within two months, though being distributed by the band itself. That brought them some major recognition in Brazil, headlining lots of shows in Sao Paulo, and also in Rio de Janeiro.

This year the band recorded their first studio LP, entitled "Bloody Vengeance". After listening to the advance tape I was really shocked, because now VULCANO is at least twice as fast, heavy, and brutal. Songs like "Dominios Of Death", "Spirits Of Evil", and "Holocaust", have a speed comparable to U.S. death metal, with thrashing rhythm changes and dirty vocals which are spewed out savagely by Angel. VULCANO really destroys now.

I hope the band will be successful outside their country, too, and they'll hopefully come to play in Chile when the LP is released. Write the band and get the LPs, T-shirts, and buttons. They're surprisingly cheap!

MUTILATOR is a very new death metal band from Belo Horizonte, Brazil, the same city of OVERDOSE and the mighty SEPULTURA. The band was formed in December of 1985 by Blacky Vomit (guitar), Rotting Christ (drums), Death Face (bass), and a vocalist, whose name wasn't given. Not long ago MUTILATOR had its current line -up completed by Evil Thrasher (lead guitar) and Killer Masturbator (vocals).

There are various influences named, such as BATHORY, HELLHAMMER, SODOM, SLAYER, SLAUGHTER, and some more. From a three-track live tape I can tell the main influence must be CELTIC FROST, which they sound very similar to, though some more own ideas would be welcome. The two originals "Evil Conspiracy" and "Visions Of Darkness" both have slow and fast riffing plus a typical death metal voice. The third track is HELLHAMMER's "Massacra", which MUTILATOR does in killer fashion, but not as fast as SLAUGHTER. In October the band will appear on a compilation LP with three other bands from Belo Horizonte, so watch for that. You can also try to get their demo or this live tape at the following address:

If "heavy metal" wasn't misused to label all those wimps and posers everywhere, it would probably be the name which would best fit OVERDOSE's style. This band, which was founded in October of 1983 in the Brazilian state of Minas Gerais, shows you what real metal is all about. They have gone through some line-up changes in their three years of existance, creating a style which is all of their own. Last year they released an EP together with SEPUL-TURA 9one side of the record for each; strange idea, isn't it?) for Cogumelo Records, an indie label of Minas Gerais. On this EP, "Século XX", they show their power and their musical abilities. The opener is "Anjos Do Apocalipse", a long track with lots of heavy time changes and incredible guitar leads. The melodic vocals aren't bad, but could come along with some more power. However, the style is very complex and will be liked by most metallers. The bandbio says the music "got many of the rhythmical variations of MERCYFUL FATE", and there are really some similarities, especially in the guitar work. Next track, "Filho Do Mundo", is fast power metal, also with rhythm changes and an insane slow lead. "Século XX", the third and last track (3 tracks in 20 minutes!), is the one I like less, because it lacks those special ideas. It's an excellent vinyl debut anyway, and it's really worth having it.

This year has seen intensive touring for OVERDOSE, having played in front of really huge audiences.

The follow up for the EP, an LP entitled "O Dia Seguinte", will be released in October, now with lyrics in English, for it will possibly be licensed by some U.S. company. Songs for it would be "Messageiros Da Morte", "Quo Vardis", and "Salven Os Coracoes", which are in the same vein as the songs on the EP. OVERDOSE is: Claudio David (lead guitar), Fernando Pazzini (bass), Bozó (vocals), Hélio (drums).

Mortalha

In July of 1984 Oscar Pestana (guitar) and Fernando Moura (drums) founded MORTALHA, which is surely one of the better metal bands in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. In January of 1985 Luiz Paulo Moura (bass) joined in, and the band started playing live. In September they decided to become a five-piece with the arrival of Bernardo de Britto Pereira (quitar) and Alan de Lerne (vocals). MORTALHA want to do power metal with technicality and aggression, and try always to put real quality into their shows and music. Their demo, which was recorded this year, has a great sound and displays a style which is pretty powerful, except for the vocals, which could be a lot heavier. "Necrofobia" is fast and really heavy, followed by an instrumental, "Stygia", in which the guitarists give their best. "Mortalha" is the best track in my opinion. Last one, "Revanches Da Furia", is slower, and I really don't like the vocals here, they're too melodic for my ears.

Let's hope to hear something new from the band soon, they are really powerful.



Formed in 1984, their line-up has always been the same: Sven Flügge (guitar), Thomas Priebe (guitar), Milo (bass), and Markus Hahn (drums). They were looking for a voca-




list a long time, but as they weren't able to find one, Milo had to take over the shouting. His vocals aren't bad, but I think a really aggressive vocalist would help to create a more unique style. Unfortunately there aren't lots of good vocalists in Germany, that's no news. Anyway, DEATHROW's style is heavy and professional, including harmony leads along with more typical riffing and good rhythm changes. Check 'em out!

VOIVOD Rrröööaaarrr (Noise / Combat Records) This LP was initially supposed to be released nearly a year ago, but for "unknown reasons" it was delayed again and again. Now that does not matter anymore, because "Rrroobaaarrr" is here and it rages to death. It's incredible, but Voivod have become even faster and heavier since their first album, of course still remaining loyal to their very special style: vocals which are simply thrown up by Snake (though sounding a bit Cronoslike), a blowing rhythm section, and the corrosive guitar riffing of Piggy, who is one of the very few thrash axemen to build up his own characteristic style. My favorite cuts on this ripping and thrashing LP are "Korgull The Exterminator", "Horror", "Thrashing Rage", and "To The Death". The production is as dirty (great!) as the one on "War And Pain", so this vinyl deserves a big fuckin' 9. If you don't have this LP yet, run out and get a copy of it! -Anton-

DETENTE Recognize No Authority advance tape Here it is, the LP of the first female fronted hardcore band, and it shows it's time to forget all prejudices and discriminations. Dawn Crosby's vocals are really heavy and aggressive, so this isn't melodic speed or power metal. It's thrash, plain and simple. The instrumental work is excellent, too, displaying a variety of rhythms and riffs that makes this LP even more interesting. Let's hope "Recognize No Authority" will be the beginning of woman's integration to the thrash movement. 8,5.

Torment In Fire
(Metal Blade Records)
This LP contains 11 tracks plus an unoriginal introduction. All the songs are fast and heavy and the technicality of their material is comparable to Dark Angel's, with a lot of influence from Slayer. The great vocalist, Rob Urbinati, the riffs, and the speed make all songs totally raging, but the music isn't original in its sound. "Sacrifice", "Infernal Visions",

the pounding song "Burned At The Stake", "Necronomicon", "Possession", "Beyond Death". The guitar work is also real good. The production is pretty good, too, making this an overall killer speed death metal piece of vinyl. If you want thrash and speed, buy this album. 8,5.

No. Possessed didn't either get faster nor did they put any boundaries around their style on their eagerly awaited second LP. They developed their death metal and added more technical skill, creating a sound that is undoubtedly original yet totally cranium destroying. Their slowing down for some tracks only enables them to put more great ideas into them, and the fast tracks simply kill, just like we knew Possessed. Jeff Becerra's shouting sounds as if he was suffering, the pounding of Mike Sus is one of the most powerful (without being technically perfect), the rhythm guitar work is much more original, and the leads have great feeling as well as death rage (listen to "Tribulation" or "Seance"). To some so called death thrashers this will probably not be fast enough, but I think it gives Possessed the right to stand before many thrash bands in the movement's rise to take the world. Without exaggerating, "Beyond The Gates" deserves a 10, and will surely be one of this year's greatest albums. -AntonBLOODLUST Guilty As Sin (Metal Blade Records) "Guilty As Sin" is the debut LP of L.A. based Bloodlust. It's a strong power metal album, and the band seems to be influenced by traditional HM as well as by thrash. What results is somewhat comparable to Abattoir, very melodic speed. The production and the instrumental work are both really good, so those who are into metal with power and melody are surely going to like this. 6.5. -Anton-

KREATOR Pleasure To Kill (Noise Records) Death, destruction, speed, thrash are otehr names for Kreator, one of the biggest and heaviest bands in Germany. All the songs on "Pleasure To Kill" are totally raging, with a lot of quality, great leads, tempo changes to fast, brutal parts, great musicianship, and corrosive voices of Mille and Ventor. This LP is much better than "Endless Pain", Kreator's debut album, and it has got a great production, so the sound quality was improved. All tracks are good, my favorite ones being "Riot Of Violence", "Pleasure To Kill", "The Pestilence", and "Ripping Corpse". Kreator showed with this LP that they are one of the best thrash bands in the world. along with Slayer, Dark Angel, Exodus, Possessed, and bands like those. So watch out for this album. CARNIVORE Carnivore (Roadrunner Records) Many of the world's magazines said Carnivore were the new thrash metal gods, and many of the world's magazines were wrong. First of all. Carnivore don't play thrash, they only play power metal with small speed parts in their songs. All the tracks are boring; the vocalist is good, but not for this type of music; the tracks have no power, and even contain ridiculous parts ("God Is Dead", "Male Supremacy") with little originality.

DARK ANGEL Darkness Descends advance tape On their second LP Dark Angel have gotten twice as great as they were on their debut. The sound is much heavier, especially guitars and bass, the drumming is faster and heavily thrashing, and Don Doty's vocals are totally aggressive, even reminding me of death metal bands, but with much of a style which is all of their own. Songs we knew from live tapes, like "Hunger Of The Undead" and the ultimate thrasher "Perish In Flames", the greatest cut from their first LP, "Merciless Death", in a new version, and new brainbashers like "Death Is Certain (Life Is Not)" are, with no exception, totally annihilating. Without any doubt I give it a 10. With this LP Dark Angel will have no problem in joining Slayer and Exodus where they stand. -Anton-

MESSIAH Hymn To Abramelin (Chainsaw Murder Records) This Messiah's vinyldebut on Dinosaur's very own Chainsaw Murder label. Both production and cover are really great, considering the conditions in which it was released and the very limited edition (2,000 copies). To the music: Messiah play a very original kind of thrash death metal ("psycho plasma terror speedcore"), combining speed with slow. black, doomy parts, and the maniac voice of "Tschösi". Though all the tracks are on the same level, the one I like most is "Messiah". I also have got to mention "The Dentist", which is the most insane track here. DRUID

Although we feature mainly the thrash / hardcore movement, we are still a heavy metal underground magazine, and will keep featuring powerful bands which have some more melody (wow!) and aren't necessarily total death.

This is the case of DRUID, a four-piece metal band based in Boston. The band, which consists of Eric Sager (vocals), Lanny Holland (guitar), Dave Mairs (drums), and Earl Ingalls (bass), has been together since last year, and released a four-track 7" EP on Crossbone Records a while ago, called "Four Curses".

The first curse, "The Robber", is a mid-paced metal song in a more classic HM vein. Second track is "Forced Entry", which has a very good chorus, also not too fast and not too slow. Maybe a better production would have made this EP heavier, but it's still good enough to appeal to a lot of metallers. "Legion (The Exorcist)" is slow and sounds pretty much like old SABBATH. It's definetely the coolest song on the record, with excellent vocals. Closing the EP is "Godsend", which to me sounds like old PRIEST, also very well done. If you like metal which has musicality and the right dose of power, and isn't trend-following at all, order this EP by sending \$ 4.50 to Crossbone Records. Besides, it has a nice cover artwork.

Prophets Of Doom

PROPHETS OF DOOM is a power / doom metal outfit from Denmark. They were formed under the name PROPHECY in 1984, and with many line-up changes their style developed from hardrock to what it is today. According to lead singer Torben Askholm, on their first demo, recorded autumn '85, their main influences were TROUBLE and BLACK SABBATH. The demo I received, "Whom Gods Destroy", was recorded in February '86, and to me the four tracks keep these influences, incorporating newer ones, too. All the tracks are longer than six minutes, with lots of heavy riffing. The track I like most is "Religious Terror", which includes a classical guitar solo (!). Overall, this band gave me a very good impression. Of course there are things that must be worked on, for example the vocals, but T. Askholm (vocals), P.M. Hansen (guitar), P. Rasmussen (drums), Michael Bodin (guitar), and C. Frederiksen (bass) are out to do it their way, and I think they will. I hope to hear more from them soon.
