EXTREME MUSIC FOR EXTREME PEOPLE!!

SUFFOCATION:

One of the most raw - and brutal live experiences, I've ever had, was when Suffocation (almost) killed Copenhagen during their Euro-tour with Konkhra and Supuration. Suffocation's music and image speak for itself...

- What do you think of this tour-package? The bands play some quite different styles of music, is that positive?

It's been going great. There have been no problems at all. Konkhra sound pretty much like us, but Supuration are a little different. The combination seems to do ok, and I have no problems. The fans seem to like the package. But you know, at times Supuration don't really do that well.. But they're ok.

- Had you heard about Konkhra or Supuration before you went on this tour? We played with Konkhra two years ago, so we knew about them. But I had never heard about Supuration before we went on tour.

- I consider myself to be an old Suffocation fan, I mean, I got your demo through tapetrading, I was totally blown away by "Human Waste" and "Effigy The Forgotten", but when I heard "Breeding The Spawn", your third CD, I was really disappointed. What do you think is the reason for this?

It's the recordcompany's fault! We wanted to go to Morrisound to record the album. What happened with the recording and stuff was that we wanted to use Scott Burns again, but the recordcompany told us that they wouldn't allow us to use him again, so we went back to the studio where we recorded the "Human Waste" album, but things just didn't turn out too well. The music is heavy and it's really there, it's the recording that isn't so good.

- I think your older material had a different approach than your new material...?

Basically, the old music and stuff takes its origin from back when we were in other bands. The new stuff is just an expression... As for the brand new material, 40% of it will be fast and 60% of it will just be heavy.

- Do you personally consider "Breeding The Spawn" to be your best release so far? If so, please explain why!

I like a lot of the songs, they are all sick tunes. It's just the production that I don't like.

- I once saw a livevideo with you, it was filmed in



N.J./N.Y., how would you compare the crowd back home to the one overhere in Europe?

It depends on the shows. We've played in Canada which was totally sick, and we played shows in California, which were really sick, too. Texas, Chicago, Paris.. It really doesn't matter.

- Speaking of New York/New Jersey, I think they have the best American scene(s). I'm thinking about such killer acts as Human Remains, Nokturnel, Torture Krypt, Damonacy, Immolation, Pyrexia etc. Do you agree with my me? Who is your fave band? Definately! I like a lot of the New Jersey bands, like Human Remains, Ripping Corpse, and Damonacy. It's a really weird scene, though, as far as people showing up at the gigs. If Human Remains were going to play at some club in N.Y., a lot of people might not go to see them, because they only know the real big bands such as Obituary and Deicide. The scene is really weird. My fave band is Macabre, and they are from Chicago.

- Not so long time ago, Pyrexia released their debut CD. As far as I'm informed, one

of the old Suffocation members is playing in Pyrexia. Do you think that this might be the reason why their music is so familiar to yours?

The only guy who has been playing in Suffocation is the guitarplayer, but that was when we just started. A lot of the members from Pyrexia have played in bands that we also played in, so it's a combination. That is probably why they sound so much alike us.

- Could you imagine Suffocation doing an ordinary Heavy Metal song, with Heavy Metal singing vocals?

I couldn't sing nice! The reason why we are not turning Heavy Metal, unlike so many other bands is that we stick to our roots. Heavy Metal is all about money. You know, if the medias gave the Death Metal videos a chance, things would be different! We just play what we've always been playing. I don't think funky Jazz would suit Suffocation, ha ha!

- How does it feel to be somebody's fave band? Is that a dream coming through?

It's cool for sure!! That is totally sick! It feels good. It's something you have always wanted. You know, when you were younger you idolized other singers, and now it's me that is being idolized...

- I heard that when Entombed played in the states they had some problems because one of their guitarists is black. You also have some black members, has that caused you guys any serious trouble?

We only have one member who is black now. Our old drummer has left. The old one is going for a Hip-Hop career. Our new drummer has got some new beats that are faster than ever before. He has played in bands like Social Disease & Welt (CD out on Progress now!! ed.). Back to the main question, we haven't really had any problems with our member(s) being black..

- I simply have to ask you to say the last, wellknown three words..!

JUST KILL PEOPLE!!





FRESH HARD CORE!!

When I heard the just released MEATLOCKER CD-EP on Progress, I was totally blown away by the band's harmony, aggression and great Hard Core. I quickly handled over some questions to Progress who again handled them over to MEATLOCKER. Rotten Ron answered my questions.

So far Meatlocker is not that wellknown in Europe, so to some of the readers, this interview might be the first time they ever hear about Meatlocker. Therefore, could you please introduce Meatlocker to a new - potential - fan?

Meatlocker, to the uninitiated, started out in 1989. At that time the scene was stagnating with boring Thrash bands and Glam bands, trying to go hard. So we appeared at a time when Florida needed a real Hard Core band. Rodney had the idea for a whole new wave of HC, in an area that was starved for something new and original. The attention grew as we opened some killer shows for Megadeth, Death, Pantera, Overkill, Agnostic Front and a ton of others. As We stand now, this is our forth bassplayer; Pat Ranieri from Hellwitch. (Whom the readers of NAGUAL should know all about since he/Hellwitch were featured in NAGUAL # 2). He has a lot of talent, and most importantly, he drinks and smokes. We get along with him really well. He has the same sick mindset.

You're not a Death Metal band, do you feel that you belong to the same scene at all? I mean, for instance you did a small US-tour with Danish Konkhra, and they play Death/Grind while you play HC. What did the auduience think about this mixture of genres?

No. We don't belong in the Death Metal scene, obviously. But when we toured with Konkhra, the mix went killer. America gets bored with one thing quickly, so the different genres worked great together. They were the coolest band to tour with. The best memory I have is walking through NYC drinking beer with young Ozzy (I believe that's Johnny of Konkhra! -ed.) and the boys.

What is it like being a HC act these days where the main focus (atleast here in Europe) obviously is being put on the Death Metal orientated bands?

Well, the focus in Tampa, and the states for that matter, is definately not on Death Metal. It's as good as dead here. We started as a HC band and that's what we will remain. And we make no apologies for it.

Compare your brand new dig. pack CD-EP to your previous releases!? Does it differ at all?

The production of "Triangle Of Pain" is definately our best. Over the years our style has gotten heavier. We were always aggressive. But I think we've found our so called "Groove" now. Songs are easier to write now.

You went to Morrisound to record "T.O.P.". Are you satisfied with the final result? I personally think that "T.O.P." is one of the best produced CD's, I've heard in a long time.

Thanks for the compliment. We are very satisfied with the CD.

Originally we were going to have Scott Burns producing. But he was busy and we went to Tom Morris. And I'm glad we did. We didn't get the standard Death Metal/Scott Burns product. Don't get me wrong, Scott Burns is a great producer, but I think Tom is more diverse and willing to listen to the band and build a unique sound. We only had four days to do the CD-EP, and Tom hung in there with us for the duration. I think we wore him out. But he has some funny shit to tell his grandkids when he gets old.

Who is YOUR God?

My God is music, volume, beer and pain.

How many people show up at a Meatlocker gig if it is well promoted? Any plans for a European-tour? And in that case, who would you like to tour with?

Our crowds differ from place to place. We've played for ten people and two thousand people. The venue's size has a lot to do with the draw. We're looking into touring Europe at the moment. Andreas (Progress) holds the reigns as far as that goes. When we do tour, we're going to do the full-lenght album there as well. I know there are some great Danish bands to tour with, but I would like to tour with Biohazard, or Sick Of It All. A tour with Konkhra again would be great. I like hanging out with Anders, Johnny and Claus, although I hear Claus is now out of the band...

As for inspirations, are you still inspired by the bands that you were inspired by when you formed the band - and who were/are they?

Our inspirations have basically stayed the same. Rodney likes the old school Punk and HC. I like older Thrash, newer HC, and new Prong. Pat, I have no idea what inspires that sick fucker. And Bill's influences are too weird to mention.

On "T.O.P." most of your songs seem to be rather angry, except for the song "Violent World" which has some "Happy" rhythms/riffs.. Has the song - despite its title - a positive message?

No. "Violent World" is about the shit situation of the world in 1994. But this song is more or less us stepping back and looking at how fucked up things are. It seems anyone and everyone has been touched by senseless, fucking stupid violence, and there is nothing anybody can do about it.

Do you consider "T.O.P." as your second album? I mean, it only lasts 15 minutes.. Why didn't you record an entire album? Is "T.O.P." just some sort of a "Hey, we're still alive + still going strong" or just "Hey, we're Meatlocker and this is how we sound" kind of thing?

Actually, we've done two full-lenght releases so far. "Keep Up The Faith" and "Brainwash", so I guess this makes "T.O.P." our third. This CD is more or less a pre-release of the full-lenght album, which is due out within a year. That's why it's only 15 minutes long. We needed to get Meatlocker heard right away.

There might be somebody out there reading this who you really detest. Anything you want to say to that those individual(s), now that you have the chance?

We don't say bad shit about anyone. The music business is tough enough, without people talking shit about you. Besides, we concentrate so much on what we are doing, we don't know who, or how many people that really hate us.

The cover of "T.O.P." shows "the carbonized corpse of sect-leader David Koresch after the tragic events in Texas summer 1993" - Why did you choose to picture his carbonized corpse, and what did you think of that particular event?

We happened upon that picture by pure luck. We didn't purposely look for it. It just fit the album title really well. It dosn't matter who was to blame for all that. The final result was people dying for stupid, fucking reasons. The charred baby head at the upper right was a nice touch also. (Ahemm... Ehh.. -ed.)

What will the world look like in 15 years? Peace? Wars? Music? Meatlocker?

In 15 years the world will be one melting pod. Everyone will look, talk, act and behave the same. Originality will be a thing of the past. Civilization will give way to mass conformity. It's happening now in small doses. Meatlocker will be one big kidney-machine.

Is NAGUAL Magazine the first magazine ever to give you a front-cover feature and what does it feel like?

Yes, Nagual Magazine is our first cover. We think it's killer! We'd like to thank you for the support, as well as all magazines that have helped us. People who are willing to help the band are few and far between in the music business.

Close this interview, please!

We'd like to thank all the people who have helped and supported us for the past 5 years. In particular Andreas Ludvigsen, our parents, Christine, The Danielles, Bjarke and the Hellwitch supporters. STAY HARD CORE, MOTHERFUCKERS!!

I hope you all enjoyed this rather unusual feature. I suggest that everybody should check out Meatlocker. They are different, strong and mean-looking (just check out the cover!). If they are the future of Hard Core, the scene looks very interesting.


Fuck You


- I'm From Denmark!!

"Fuck You We're From Denmark" is Danish based Progress' trademark. As you might know, Progress once was a very professional tatoo/extreme music magazine, but the unit behind Progress decided to concentrate on the(ir) recordlabel, Progress Red Labels. Thirteen releases later (incl. albums with Illdisposed, Konkhra, Maceration & Detest), the monicker was changed into Progress Records.

The most (be)loved and hated Progress releases must be the "Fuck You We're From Denmark" series. The three volumes of the "Fuck You..." compilation CD's have together featured not less than 46 Danish Metal acts. Of course not all of the bands on a compilation are equally good, and that is also the case with the third volume. But listening to Condemned, Revolting Phimosis, Autumn Leaves, Idiosyncrasy and Coitus Interruptus certainly make this volume well worth your money - it IS a good compilation!! Unfortunately, some narrowminded, idiotic (Danish) reviewers/editors have got the impression that the more they talk down about the "Fuck You.." series, the cooler they (the so called editors/reviewers) are. Well, let me quote the CD title and address it to you guys: "FUCK YOU!!"

Afterall, the "Fuck you..." series have featured lots of Danish bands with potential, and they sure make ME proud of being Danish. FUCK YOU, I AM FROM DENMARKIII





Bjarke Ahlstrand got the idea to form NAGUAL Magazine after he had been singing in his band, IDIOSYNCRASY for a while, and was therefore involved with the underground scene, on a smaller basis. As he was very attracted to the scene, Bjarke decided to form his own magazine, NAGUAL. The name, NAGUAL, was found in a SF-cartoon by Moebius, and "NAGUAL is a metaphysical conception which indicates the non-created, that part of the godly which lies beyond the imagination of man".

The first issue had 64 A5 pages, was well-recieved in the underground, and the 400 copies quickly sold out. The second issue contained 32 A4 pages of a much higher layout and printing quality. The response on the second issue was overwhelmingly great. As for the standards of the third issue, read on, and be surprised!

DEMONIZING HORROR AND OTHER TAPES OF TERROR

CHEMICAL BREATH adv. for CD After the (too) usual keyboard, windblowing intro, C.B.'s Thrash-Death, which in fact is very similar to older Sepultura, starts off. The sound on this adv. tape isn't convincing at all. Also, most of the music/riffs seem to be stolen! BLACK DAWN "War Against Christians" Demo This demo is the result you get when you mix heavy and midpaced Death Metal with growling and Black Metal orientated vocals. As a matter of fact, this demo sounds truely evil.. Really blasphemeous and scary. Juvosentie 2, 60550 Nurmo, Finland. CONDEMNATION "The Fall Of Lucipher" Demo The prof. cover immediately impressed me. But Condemnation's music hasn't - after several listenings impressed me. The band's Christian Death-Thrash lacks of depth and brutality. It's no good if only 30% of the riffs are cool, and that is the problem here. Another minus is that the vocals, which are dark and mumbling, are hidden in the otherwise overall good production. P.O. Box 6, 33-100 Tarnów 1, Poland. FROZEN SOULS "Flesh In Armour" Demo F.S. claim to be playing "Hedonistic enochian tabularasa surpreme metal" (!?!?).. Strange. In my ears their music sounds like some very heavy and primitive Doom Metal, with a deep and growling vocalist. A little like Dutch Beyond Belief, actually. The music has its charm though, and that makes the monotonous playing listenable. Postfach 150563, 67030 Ludwigshafen, Germany. GODFALL "Demo 1" The guitars were the first elements that caught my attention here. They still are, and that's very understandable since they've got the magic "spark" throughout the entire demo. They're a little equal to Dark Tran.'s sound and playing (unbelieveable harmonies), but that don't make them less interesting. Combined with the steady rhythm-section and the understandable, gargling vocals, the result is a killer demo, definately a must!! Parkinperä 4C 30, 40740 Jyväskyla, Finland. NECROLUST "Faces Of Evil" Demo Necrolust seem to be a Satanic band, judging from their songtitles. The music is very primitive Death Metal with a deep voice, downtuned guitars and of course (?) a bad sound. I don't mind primitive music, but this is too much! And actually all the songs sound the same. Ul. Milusinsiich 4/20, 43-300 Biclsk-Biata, Poland. (JC) HAZAEL "Clairvoyance" Demo I must admit that Hazael isn't my fave band due to their badproduced, bobti bobti Death Metal. This sounds very out-dated, and there are several other Polish bands which are much better than Hazael. Buczka 3, 74-400 Debno Lub, Poland. (JC) VISCERAL EVISCERATION "Savour Of...." Demo "Sick" must be the keyword here. The lay-out is very cool, coloured photos etc. Musical wise, I thought this would be in the Carcass or Cannibal Corpse vein, but this is more midpaced and sometimes really doomy. V.D. have added a doze of female vocals and keyboards which make the band sound like nobody else. This demo is now released on CD by Napalm Rec. Posthorngasse 3/13, 1030 Vienna, Austria. (JC) ANGELKILL "Garden Of Crosses" Demo This certainly is weird. I can't say that I like it, but Angelkill sure create some weird metal, and their style is indefianable. The vocalist sounds like Kind Giamond (sorry, King Diamond!) and the drummer obviously only knows one rhythm. Box 371, LaClaire, IA. 52753, U.S.A. (JC) THE ETERNAL "Demo" This piece of Death Metal comes with a cool cover and all. The music is best described as listenable Death Metal with keyoboards. Unfortunately the whole thing turns out a little too traditional at times. Their slower parts are definately the best, and in my opinion, the band should stay slow! Schoppenhaverg. 25/5, 1180 Vienna, Austria. (JC) (JC) MANGLED "Perish" Demo Mangled could very well have been a Danish band (they are Dutch), since their music is pretty "Danish-sounding" without the thrashy elements, though. So this is - in case you don't know, what I'm talking about midpaced - and rather predictable DM. Not really boring, just a little bit too standarized, especially the vocals. The sound is really good, heavy and clear. DISMAL "Untergangsstimmung" Demo The primitive, rehearsel alike recording doesn't do the band any good justice. First of all there is the bad sound, secondly the lack of tightness and so forth. Wait for Dismal's next release! Dürerweg 40, 58509 Lüdenscheid, Germany. BREED "Bang To Black R&R" Demo The lyrics: "We're diciples of Jesus, Black Magic won't tear us apart, cos' we all know he is a fart". The music: A rock band trying to sound brutal, but not even the screaming

vocals succeed in doing that. Chaos Prod., P.O. Box 3812, 903 15 Umeå, Sweden. INFERNAL GATES "In Sadness..." Demo What really makes I.G. different and more interesting than many other bands is in fact that even though they're a brutal band, they still have harmonies, and you certainly can hear what they're doing. Nice "dancing" guitarriffs, rather tight playing and the sound is ok too. The vocals could have been better + more understandable, but then again. Asav. 14, 665 33 Kil, Sweden. FALLEN ANGEL "Embraced By Shadows" Promo F.A.'s last effort showed great potential, but this is much better than I'd expected. "Embraced..." clearly states that F.A. are one of the best unsigned acts around. Their new songs are so fast and wellplayed. Especially the drummer amazing.. And the band certainly isn't a fake since their liveperformance is at least as intense! Great Grind/Death! A must!!! Skovhastrupvej 26, 4330 Hvalsø, Denmark.
MAGGOTY CORPSE "Baptisma" Demo Don't worry, M.C.'s music is a lot better than their name! Still, it's perhaps a little too Cannibal Corpse inspired at times. But in general, M.C. are a lot heavier than C.C. M.C. is not a bad band, and their music certainly has its highlights now and then, so... 6-6-12-306, 1 Sobe, Mihama-Ku, Chiba City, Chiba 261, Japan. "ARS MORENDI" Comp. tape Featuring bands from 8 different countries, this is an "international" comp. Except from the embarressing O.M.D.P. feature, this is around average. Featuring everything in between Azael (NZ) to Icelandic Death masters, Sororicide. All the bands are in the Black/Death spectrum. Belgischestraat 46b, 3028 TH Rotterdam, Holland. TENEBRAE "Dysanchelium" CD-adv. There's absolutely nothing wrong with Tenebrae's heavysounding, midpaced metal, but the vocals don't fit the music at all, and as a matter of fact, they damage the music quite a bit. I'm sure that Tenebrae's future releases will put "Dysan..." to dust. Kylosuontie 8 C 35, 00300 Helsinki, Finland. HOMICIDE "Retaliation Fall" Demo I was glad when I recieved and listened to this tape, since it has got the professionalism and high standards which the band's previous effort(s) was lacking off. Homicide are now sounding like an early version of Slayer, which of course is meant positive! V. le Matteotti 340, 20099 Sesto S. Giovanni, Milano, Italy. EUTHANASIA "Cassette EP 1994" (Emanzipation Pds.) The first release from Emanzipation Pds. with Italian Euthanasia shows great potential. A 4 song grinding Death Metal experience which is best described as a mixture of Deicde & Suffocation. Yeah, in fact Deicide would be the best comparizon after all. Not a tape to miss. Holbergsvej 137, 4700 Næstved, Denmark. AFFLICTED "Promo 1993" Ha, ha, ha! Actually, this isn't funny since Afflicted seem to be serious about this piece of shit. The band has moved away from their original Death/Psychedellic style, and the music is now pure Power Metal. That is not Afflicted! Afflicted should not have released this under the same monicker since they will confuse a lot of fans. Ignore this. P.O. Box 9023, 12609 Hägersten, Sweden. 



Deranged surely must be one of the most busy Swedish bands... So far their releases include a demotape, a 7" EP on Obliteration Rec. and... Their debut mini-CD should also be out now on Drowned Prod. and it's entitled "Architects Of Perversion". "Architects..." is in my opinion a little too close to the band's previous releases, and it has both sound and musical-wise a rather monotonous approach. As we move in the Deranged discography, we find their new mini-CD, which is due for release on Invasion Rec. It seems like the music will always come second, when it comes to G.W.A.R. Judging from the bands absolutely sensational live-appearances, you might think that they play Death Metal, but that is not the case. The music that G.W.A.R. deliver is a confusing mixture of Metal, HC, Thrash and Punk. I personally think that their best effort is their '90 "Scumdogs Of The Universe" (Which has just been re-released in Europe), but also the band's latest opus, "This Toilet Earth" (Metal Blade/Mis. Label), clearly shows what G.W.A.R. is all about, musically. When the shit hit the Danish fans in Christiania, your faithful reporter + crew managed to get hold of the Sexecutioner (Prime-minister of pain) himself...

- How have the fans recieved the shit so far?

Well, they like it, of course. They come and they die. Most of them live their normal lives until we come to their countries and kill them. But the rest of the world seem to be in some sort of a grand deception. It's only responsible journalists, like yourself (If only he knew... -ed.) that are able to get the truth out.

- What's the best gig or slaughter that you have ever participated in?

- I personally think that "Scumdogs..." still is your best release so far. I don't think you've been able to create the same atmosphere and fun on your newer recordings...!?

That depends on the steady musicians of that time. "Funny" is also a subjective form, and we do not care what anybody else think. We just perform the ballads as they come to us. We shit, we fart, we tapdance! You ask a question that I, the Sexecutioner, can not exactly answer. Because I'm just but a humble officer playing his part, I'm not a conductor or musician, I just sing sometimes. The magic that was on "Scumdogs...", I think it was because G.W.A.R. at one time wanted commercial succes, but then we gave up.

- So "Scumdogs..." was going for a more commercial outstanding?

You are the first person... Well, actually you are the second to really say that, the first one is dead... (*Ups...-crew.*). I know that everything we do is "platin" standard. "Scumdogs..." was a gem to you, to us it's just a piece of shit!

- What does your mother think about the way you look and behave?

My mother is dead, I killed her! (Well, I guess the question is pretty outdated then. -ed.).

- Is Elvis dead?

Of course he is not dead! We are able to reanimate him, we've got his corpse along with all the other celebrities that we have back home. We have drinks and write songs together.

- Have you ever met any (famous) serial-killers beside yourselves, Ed

Of course I write to them and visit them at their earthly prisons. They are the biggest G.W.A.R. fans on Earth. Ed Gein is dead now, but I haven't managed to reanimate him. Yet... He is a big fan of mine.

- Do you think that everyone on Earth will ever get to know G.W.A.R.?

Once your head is chopped off... Well how do you know G.W.A.R.? You come to the realization "Yes, I'm dead- it was G.W.A.R.". The governments of all the countries are doing a good job of establishing the G.W.A.R. phenomenon, the message. We are next to U.F.O.'s in popularity. I mean, we are Unidentified Flying Objects!


- And now to a question, which I know, you have answered before. If i ask you today - what does G.W.A.R. mean?

G.W.A.R. translates very, very, very, very loosely, in human terms as some sort of a growl of dissatisfaction. The real meaning is contempt, sometimes hate...

"Destroy all life on this planet, all others must be slaves!!". That is as close as you can possibly come, next to your death, of understanding what G.W.A.R. means. A gutteral fart.

- Has anybody been really hurt at a G.W.A.R. concert, besides yourself (At the time being, the Sexecutioner had a broken arm)?

I really don't like to hurt people. I like to kill them fast and then rape them. Of course there are many people hurt. In fact, I want to retract that statement that I was ever a person, and that I was ever hurt. I hope that all people get hurt.

PSYCHO is the name of one of the oldest and most devoted Grind Core acts and the band has released a big amount of vinyl... PSYCHO is a pure underground band, and their music certainly is enjoyable.. Charlie Infection speaks out..

Psycho has been around for quite some years.. Exactly when did you form, and do you know precisely how many releases you've put out since then?

Psycho got together in 1982 - I joined in 1984. John is the only original member remaining. This line-up has been together since 1990. It's me (Charlie) on drums + vocals, Johnny X on guitar and vocals and Mike on bass + vocals. Right now we have 11 releases out - but by the time you read this we'll have a new 7" out called "Shrunken" 7" and we plan, also this year, split 7"es with Nasum + Rot and later on we'll do splits with Mortician and possibly Impetigo too.

What are you guys up to at this moment? Writing new songs, touring, what?!?

We're releasing the "Shrunken" 7" and we're working on adding 3 new tunes and 6 old tunes into our set for our August tour of mid-west America. Our set will consist of 30 songs - 40 minutes + it's fucking intense!!

You've been playing Grind Core for a long time, and you're still playing it. How is it like being a Grind Core band among so many (Death) Metal bands?

It's cool. It's like a breath of fresh air, because we don't sound like any other band. We have a unique sound consisting of Hard Core, Death Metal, Grind, Thrash, Doom, Noise etc. So it's a bit different than your average Death band, know what I mean?

Who tought you to play/grind so fast on the drums?

I basically tought myself, I just played fast Thrash for so long I naturally keep getting faster and faster.

A.C. has signed to Earache who've put out their new "Everyone should be killed" CD, do you think Psycho will ever go commercial and sign to a major label? Isn't Grind Core supposed to stay underground?

I'm sure if we were signed by Earache, we would accept it, in a heart beat, I would love to tour with Napalm or Carcass!! That would be cool, but being on our own label is very cool. We have complete control over our products (cover, lyric contents, etc.). I love doing it on our own label, but I only wish for better distribution, that's the only drawback! I like being an underground band, but we need to get our name around more, so that's the drawback.

I know you've done some US-tours, and that there's talk about a European-tour. Is The European-tour going to come through or what?

We've been waiting to play in Europe for the last 4 years!! No one wants to take a chance with us. We haven't played in Europe so no one really know us... This is where being so underground can hurt you. Once again we'll try to hook up with a band who has equipment + a van to help us out and tour with us in 1995. Any bands interested? How about you Bjarke? Let us know!!

Did you know that Assuck did a European tour?

Yes. But we also heard that the vocalist, Paul, wasn't there... They're not Assück without Paul, but I heard he's back now too!! We were supposed to do a split with them, but they don't keep in touch.

Who's the best chick in the world? Tracy Lords??

Tracy is way over-rated I think... I think Madonna is pretty fucking hot + she's a total slut!!

Last but not least - are you a Psycho? How old are you guys by the way, why is your last name Infection - and do you have any last words??

The word "Psycho" reflects our stage show - Total chaos on stage!! Why do you want to know my age? I'm 27, John's 27 and Mike's 24. I like the name Infection it's a lot easier to pronounce than my "real" last name, I've been using "Infection" since 1983. Last words... Find a band to tour with us in 1995, maybe we'll finally play in Europe!! We have T-shirts and records to sell, so write to us, OK!! Thanks a lot for your time!

The Dutch scene seems to continue to grow. One of the best new bands, to emerge from Holland is Consolation, an angry-sounding and extreme act. Their debut (split) cd is a real monster, so I had to contact the Consolation camp.

- Why did you release a split cd instead of a "full" cd? Don't you think that it easily could be a problem if somebody only like one of the bands on a split?

Nobody knew Consolation. N.H. already had a big name in the underground, so they gave us the privilege to appear with them. I think that now most people know us so the next one will be us alone.

You know with this split-cd you get two great bands for the price of less than one! So who is complaining?

- What is it like to be on such a small label as Displeased Rec.? Are they currently satisfying your needs? I mean, wouldn't you prefer to be on a major label, and have your music available in every record-store around the world?

It's great to be on Displeased Rec. The guys are our friends, so.. I think that one day they will be a big underground label (Roadrunner watch out!). The problem with bigger labels is that they own you. No motherfucker tells me how to write my music. We do everything ourselves, artwork etc. Independence is

a gift, so take it and keep it. Major companies steal that from you through money and pressure.

- How would you describe your music and style? To me you sound like an "Angry Metal" band. Here I'm especially thinking about the vocals, which sound very furious...

Angry is the word. I don't think we could make this sort of music if we didn't have some sort of frustration. We particularly dislike the abuse of power in every way. Most of our songs and lyrics contain that message. The style we play can be described as Grind Core, the way Morbid Angel or Terrorizer does it.

- So, do you usually come up with ideas for new songs when you are at a "Coffee-bar" or what? Describe the look and atmosphere of such a "Coffee-bar"! How do you feel about the legalization of soft-drugs (Hash) in Holland. Is it a good thing, and should the Dutch model be used as standard for the other European countries?

No, we never get our ideas at a "Coffee-shop". It's more the opposite way. We play ultra-aggressive, hyper-speed Grind. You try and do that when you are stoned, only Doom Metal comes out of it then. A "Coffe-shop" is a relaxed place with a nice atmosphere, where you can buy and smoke weed, (hash) while you drink some tea. It's ok. There is no harm in it, it should be legalized everywhere! But watch out, it can be dangerous, just like any other drug. You might end up at a hospital, if you use too much - or bad - stuff. So blow, at good "Coffeeshops" only.

- On your latest offering to the immense metalmarket, a 7" EP, I think you have changed style a bit. Are you heading towards the more cultivated/pure Grind Core sound? What do you think of GC in general?

Yes, "The Truth" EP had to be our ultimate statement. You know, we could have gone commercial. Almost every band sells their soul, we didn't, we are Metal! And we stay that way. We are the anarchists of the Metal scene. As for our opinion about Grind Core: It rules! I greet my colleagues from Dead Infection, Kataklysm, Morbid Angel, Malevolent Creation, Necrony etc. Keep it fast and tight!

- Are you an active band as far as gigs/concerts go? I have heard you have been on a minitour? We are pretty active doing our cd-tour. One or two gigs a week, for about four to five months. And in October we will go on a European tour. This week we play at the "Rock Palace" in Amsterdam.

- When was the last time you saw a band live, and said to yourself "Wow, this is great!"? The Beasty Boys!! Freedom in music and freedom in speech!

- The Dutch scene is incredibly big. There are so many bands popping out all the time. How do you look upon it? Can it be compared to the Swedish or Finnish scene(s) for that sake?

I think the big boom is just about over. The bad bands are already dissapointed and have stopped, so the good ones remain. And that's good, I think. I don't see comparisons to other scenes. In Holland every band has some sort of own style, with their specific sound. So there is a great variety around here. Almost every Swedish band sounds the same because of the production/sound.

- I've got no more to say - Have you?



Don't believe in any false gods/religions, Satans, Allahs, Krishnas etc. Just believe in yourself and the people around you. Don't let people fuck you around too much, stand by your rights even if that means violence (last solution)! Try, like me, to say less words like "fuck" and "motherfucker", they are just hypes. And you know what Public Enemy said, "Don't believe the hype"... And listen to Grind Core!

For a fresh piece of angry music, check out Consolation. They are well worth your attention. The split-cd with Nembrionic Hammerdeath costs 16\$, their brand new EP costs 6\$ and shirts/Bermuda shorts cost 12\$ each.



The Album Of The Year 1994

Finnish masters of mayhem, Amorphis, already showed great potential with their debut, "The Karelian Isthmus". But now they're back with what seems to be the album of the year, "The Land Of Thousand Lakes" (Relapse/N.B.) With "The Land...", Amorphis are going new ways musical-wise. The obvious oriental influences, and the at times "normal" singing vocals bring the music to new heights of both harmony and originality. This is a varied master-piece of original Death-Doom, and it must be checked out! A musical eargasm!!



CHORUS OF RUIN 'Ocean Of Sins' (Avantgarde) I somehow had the impression that C.O.R. would be Black Metal.. That is not the case. The two songs here are both doomy and rather harmonic, but hey, the band is from the

U.K., so... If Doom is your game, Chorus Of Ruin is certainly for you.

REVOLUCION X "Same" (New Wave)

There is one reason why you should obtain a copy of this: The killer + very informing poster/booklet that it comes with! That sure is an interesting piece of historical litterature. The music itself is bad-produced, out-dated and way too predictable Mexican Punk/Rock.

LACERATION 'Ripping Avulsion' (Gutted)

This is the kind of simple Doom/Death Metal which everyone can play if only they know such simple chords as A, E and G, because those are the only "riffs" used here!

SCUM 'Same' (Sickness)

These 6 Finnish deathsters really took away my breath.. The 3 (!) heavy guitars combined with simple, yet wellsounding drums and bassplaying are spiced with some freezingly vocals - woodh - this is a heavy and killing slap of vinyl! It's really hard for me to remove this one from my turnable since it's so great! Some of the best "underground" Death available! SCUM c/o Toni Peiju, Opintie 21, 59100 Parikkalen, Finland.

GORE BEYOND NECROPSY 'This Is An EP You Want' (MMI)

First of all, I'll just conclude that the music here doesn't live up to the bragging title! This is dirty, downtuned, muddy Japanese Grind/Death with a totally unrealistic drummachine. The drum-machine really destroys a lot here, and it makes this 7" turn out way too messy for my ears.

INFERNAL HEIRACHY 'Same' (Rage)

I.H. are from the land of the many states - and many Death Metal bands - U.S.A. But hell no, don't get me wrong since I.H. is not just another D.M. band. Nope, the two songs here are both interesting, thought through and varied. You gotta get this.

ETERNAL TORMENT 'Confined Within Consciousness' (Gutted)

Another heavy thing. This time it has a swing to it. The downtuned rhythms are what really make this listenable. Where the originality lacks, the heaviness sets in. This is not the coolest 7", but still it's worth checking out.

TOXIC NARCOTIC "New Ways To Create Waste" (RP)

Watch out! You might get addicted to this Toxic Narcotic 7". It certainly is an original effort! Basically T.N. is some sort of mixture of Punk & Thrash, and the vocals are almost growling. A little hard getting into. That's actually the problem here.

BRAIN POLICE "Bullet" (Red Stream)

This release is like all other Red Stream releases this far - alternative. B.P. is in this case a synoym for industrial music with a very heavy approach. Weird - sure! Heard before never! So is it worth checking out then - sure, if you wanna hear something alternative!

NOCTURNUS 'Mummified' (Moribund)

The last and best release from the wellknown American Techno-Death act. Noctumus has always had a high, technical level, even though they have never been overwhelmingly catchy. It's the way they mix the keyboards with the music, and the splendid guitawork of Mike Davis that make this sound different and cool. Get this monster-vinyl now!

DETERIOROT 'Manifested Apparitions...' (Drowned)

This is the last Drowned 7" release (a shame), but unfortunately not the best. That honour still goes to Swedish Darkified (r.i.p.). This 7" has two brutal tunes, performed the "American" way. There is nothing wrong with them, they just don't catch my attention, and that is sad.

NO FRAUD 'Same' (New Wave)

And I thought that messy Punk was dead. Obviously not?! But as far as I'm concerned, De Skrigende Halse still is THE Punk band. No Fraud seem to be doing what others did 10 years ago, so frankly, this suck. Punk har aldrig været det samme efter Ronnies død...

BELIAL 'The Gods Of The Pit Pt. II' (Moribund)

Belial has always been a cool band, as far as I can recall. Nowadays they sound a little like Impaled Nazarene, while they on this one, which is a re-release of their old demo, sound like a little wilder version of Bolt Thrower. Cool enough. The only minus here is the last song, which is too chaotic, sound and musicalwise.

ROUTE NINE 'Before Close My Eves Forever (Inorganic) Yet another project by an Edge Of Sanity

member has been but to vinv!! Ahem.. To

begin with I really enjoyed this one, but now I'm getting tired of it, especially its "sweet" choruses. We heard that Osmose Prod. have signed R9 now.. What will be the next? A CD with an Edge Of Sanity member singing in the bath or perhaps playing air-guitar?!?

SOLSTICE 'An Era Of Weary Virtues' (MMI)

No way! It can't be the boys on the backcover of this EP who are performing the music! The music - which is in the Doom/Death vein is rather powerful, although Solstice share the same problem as so (too) many other D.M. bands, and that is of course the lack of variation. But as I said, this is a nice slap of vinyl, so you should know what to do...

ACHERON 'Alla Xul' (Gutted)

Acheron are back with their so far best release. They continue their oldschool (Unleashed vs. Massacre alike) Death Metal. Again, the lyrics seem to be very important, but I must admit that it's the music which makes the biggest impression on

DEAD 'Slaves To Absymal Perversity' (MMI)

Average Porno/Gore, perverted Death/Grind with obvious Carcass influences. Nothing particular good or bad, just very, very, very, very, very sick music. Sick?? Sick!!

EPIDEMIC 'Same' (Rage/Metal Blade)

Epidemic deliver some of the most fresh and heavy Thrash-Death I've heard in a long time. As a matter of fact, Epidemic sound a little like the legendary Incubus. All the songs have the same strong strength and power, and this EP us highly recomendable.

S&Q/ADIPOCERE Split EP (Red Stream)

Red Stream Rec. contiune to unveil.. Weird stuff. In fact, I won't even label this as music. more like sounds with "rhythm". This is only for the really extreme people!

ENTETY 'Cadaveric Necrogrind' (Gothic)

This one is really dirty.. The guitars are sooo downtuned, the vocals like a deep murmur and the overall production is nothing to brag about either. These two tunes of extremely brutal (American) Death/(necro)Grind are simply too messy for my taste, but fans of Mortician might like this... Entety, 3826 Lomites Dr., LA, CA., 90032, U.S.A.

MEAT SHITS 'Bowel Rot' Double 7' (Champagne)

The 134 (!) songs appearing on this double 7" were originally recorded and released back in '90 as the band's "Bowel Rot" demo. Now the whole thing has been re-edited and re released. M.S. were and still are noisy, grinding, well mostly noisy. It's pretty funny listening to, but if you wanna check out the Meat Shits, buy their "Ecstasy Of Death" CD(on Moribund Rec) instead, since it's more mature, controlled, better played, and it has a better sound. CONSOLATION 'The Truth' (Displeased)

The new offering from the Dutch kings of anger is more Grind Core orientated than any of their previous releases, but definately not less interesting! Buy this sucker!

IMPRECATION 'Sigil Of Baphomet' (Drowned)

Imprecation have a very good reputation in the international underground scene due to their very heavy sound, the many heavy Doom parts - and even their heavy (!) Grind parts. Yep, everything is just so fucking heavy when it comes to Imprecation...

SARNATE 'Cosmopolitan' (Regress)

The music played by the 4 Finnish chaps, who together are Samate, is a little hard for me getting into. I suppose their music can be described as DM with a Thrash-sound. And where are the vocals? If only Samate had more vocals/singing, their music would probably have sounded a lot better. Regress Rec., C.P. 5045, 00153 Rome, Italy.

HYPERNOID "Dust In The Wind" (Displeased)

What makes Hybernoid different from so many other bands in the Doom/Death vein is first of all the very dominanting bass-sound - and playing. Also, the fact that Hybernoid occasionally end up sounding more or less "industrial", without using any computer effects, make their 7" this interesting. Hybernoid's debut CD should be out soon on hardworking Displeased Records as well. I'm looking forward to that one





Upcoming Moribund releases: Meatshits "Fuck Frenzy" CD, "Music From A Polluted World" Comp CD, NME "Unholy Death" CD, Phantasm "TBA" CD, Meatshits "Violence Against Feminist Cunts/Sniper At The Fag Parade" CD, Manes debut CD, Winds of The Black Mountains 7" + Debut CD

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KONKHRA is the name of one of the most brutal and tight bands to come out of Denmark. After two wellselling demos, they were the first band to be signed on Danish based Progress. That has so far resulted in two CD's, of which the newest, "S.A.D." definately is the strongest. A hot evening in July, I moved my ass to Konkhra's rehearselroom. There I had this little conversation. Anders (Voc + Guitar) was the most talkative, but Johnny (Drums) and Lars (Bass) also gave their contributions.

- There have been quite a few line-up changes lately. Is Konkhra still "Konkhra" now that formingmember Claus is out?

No, it's a totally different band.. NO, of course we're (still) Konkhra! Things have only gotten better with these line-up changes. - So far you can say that Konkhra has tried and achieced a lot of things. Especially compared to other Danish bands. You've released 2 CDs, been on a small US-tour and on a real European-tour, even with the "famous" Suffocation.. How does it feel to be one of the bands which has tried most things?? More than Invocator?!

Well, it's obvious that here in Denmark, Invo-cator is the band with the biggest seniority, but ehh.. We toured with Suffocation, and they played with Cemetery in front of 15 people in Germany. That can't really be called successful...

- So, what would you like to try out now? We'd like to do a complete US-tour, including Canada and Mexico. I see that as a thing which I'd really like to do/try. And when we've tried that (maybe in '95), there will be new things which we wanna try..

- "S.A.D." is in my eyes a very strong album, both production - and soundwise. What surprised me the most was the tightness. Do you really rehearse that much?

Do you think it's tight? Ha ha.. Well, it must be tight! You can't release an album which isn't tight. Anyway, some do it.. The tightness is our way of being special, I mean, we don't wear corpsepaint, burn churches or beat up others or anything. We rehearse instead of acting foolish. We rehearse as often as possible, about 4 times a week, I think.

Except for the production (Sunlight), "S.A.D." is a very Danish piece of art. Danish recordlabel, the cover was drawn by a Dane (Michael Kvium).. Why didn't you complete the circle and record "S.A.D." here in Denmark? Where the fuck should we have recorded it then? Where? There's no capacity or producer here, which on this field can deliver anything with international class! The Sweet Silence Studios (Metallica, Morbid Angel etc. ed.) is located 200 metres away from here. The reason that we didn't record in Sweet Silence was that it costed the double price, and also because the only Death Metal thing which Flemming Rasmussen has done so is the new Morbid Angel, and that's shitty!

- How does Progress treat you? Do you feel that they're doing enough for you?

Yeah, because we've always gotten most. I would be a creep if I said that.. Well, you know?! There are things about Progress that you can't get anywhere else, and then again



there are things that they can't do for us, but then again, they can give us things which we can't get elsewhere, for instance that I can just call the layout guy, and tell him what and how I want things to be.

- The Roskilde festival just ended. Howcome has Konkhra never played there?

I think you should ask Roskilde why we haven't played there yet! Because we don't know why. We'd like to do it! Well, I have a suspicion... Throughout the years we've been "victims" to several shitty things, which always seem to end the same place. For instance, a long time ago we were told by Mads and Tomas Seiffert from Infrarouge that we could open for Morbid Angel here in Denmark. Imagine how happy we were.. Then things got screwed up. But then Tomas Seiffert promised us another gig. Then we didn't hear from them in 11/2 year. So I called Tomas up, and told him that he owed us a gig. He said he remembered that, and then he told us that we could play with Death and Carcass. Then I went to Lars (Bass) and told him that we were going to open for Death and Carcass. Then he was totally confused because one week earlier, Tomas had told Furious Trauma (Lars' old band) that they were gonna open. And now it gets "funny". So I was sure that we were going to play with Death and Carcass. But when the gig was announced the poster said that Detest was gonna open! At that very moment, I was getting tattooed (To your information, Anders has A LOT of tattooes. -ed.) and I had to borrow the shop's phone. But since I couldn't get a hold of any of them, I went directly to their office, and there they were - Tomas and Mads. When they saw me they looked like they had been beaten up by their mother or something. I asked them what the fuck they were doing. Then Tomas called Germany and asked whether another band could open as well. We were "allowed" to open as well, but the same day as the gig took place, we were told that we were gonna play first. Detest, who had released one demotape, and at that time sold lousy 300 copies. Then we seriously discussed whether we were gonna open or not. What was gonna happen when we played before a demoband that was clearly "smaller" than us at such a big gig? Perhaps people would think that Detest are bigger than we are.. I don't want this to sound like I'm pissed off because Detest got a good chance, but you know... It's a shame, but Tomas Seiffert is like a link to Metal here because he's got this booking-agency, and he's also got a lot to do with Roskilde. That is perhaps the reason why Konkhra is never gonna play at Roskilde... (Anders & co. are looking very bitter now: -ed.)

- What about the Danish scene? Konkhra now consits of members from Insemination and Furious Trauma. The other members from the abovemen-tioned bands have also joined up with other more or less "wellestablished" Danish bands (Illdisposed, Detest etc.) Why do you (Johnny) think that neither Insemination or Furious Trauma became any bigger?

I don't know about Furious Trauma, but Insemination just went down. Our bassplayer went to Greenland, and that was that. Besides we didn't do very well, we didn't sell that many demotapes. Also, our music perhaps wasn't "Dead" enough, perhaps the audience that came to our gigs expected something more brutal..?

- What do you think about the new bands here in Denmark that pops out these days?

I don't know what we think about them. That depends on who you're talking about. I haven't heard any convincing new bands lately. Some bands release a demotape, and then it's just like "cheese". I just heard Mordor, they're like that. Most bands lack of sound and... There are a few bands that are ok, though. But, I think it's very dissapointing that a Danish band, which is obviously at a demo stage gets to release a CD!

- What is Konkhra doing in excactly one year? Then we're hopefully on a US-tour with Suffocation. When Claus (ex. guitar + voc. ed.) went to the states we really tried to fix a tour, but the Americans just won't listen to you unless you speak native American. But in the end, the manager of Suffocation told me that he'd like to do the important calls for us. Then things started to happen! He was told that we could get a tour with Suffocation by the summer of '95. We're really hoping and counting that it will come through. It also depends on whether Nuclear Blast (which is releasing and marketing all the Progress releases out of Scandinavia. -ed.) will do a harder job over there...

- You mentioned earlier on that you were going to the studio in a few months.. New CD or EP?

Both! We'll record 14 songs. Then we do an EP with 5 songs and a CD with 10 songs. They will be released a few months after eachother. That way we get a bigger budget. The new stuff will of course be recorded at Sunlight. It's gonna be cool to get back there..


- How do you feel the press has been treating you. You're not the most interviewed Danish band.. (Then we had a long conversation about one major Danish newspaper in particular - E.B., which has been giving the band - and the entire metal-scene a hard time). ...Well, I think there has been too little attention from the general press.. I think the entire genre has been totally ignored by the entire pressmedia, like the Danish "Grammy-Award" for instance. The entire "Heavy-Rock" catagory has been blown to pieces! The problem is that the genre still is underground. Take Entombed for instance, they had to be big overseas before they won awards. So it is!

- That was all.. I don't know if any of you guys have anything to say...?

Stay heavy, ha ha.- Lars would like to be quoted for that one, ha ha ha. Support the underground and all that stuff. Please buy our next demotape, ha ha ha..

After the interview I had the chance to hear some of the new Konkhra tunes. They seem to be in the same vein as their previous material. The band has actually found their own way of playing Death/Grind. Now I only wish, and hope that they'll get someone to do the desperate screams which Claus, who is not the band anymore, used to do.. Konkhra is a band with ambitions, and I'm sure that they're here to stay! For fanclub, contact:

THERION is the kind of band, which constantly change their music and sound. That, and the fact that their music seriously kills, convinced me that I had to interview the most promising Swedish band. It should be mentioned that THERION's latest release, "Ho Drakon - Ho Megas" is an orchestral orgasm, combining occult/classic elements with an old-style mixture of Heavy and Death Metal. Frontman Christofer speaks out.

- So what are the latest news from the THERION camp?

We're now in the middle of changing record-label (again) and have made a few recordings to raise the offers. All songs for the upcoming album are ready.

- You have released one mini-LP and three albums, but despite that, you're still not that "big" or wellknown. What do you think is the reason for this?

First of all, we have always played a bit avantgarde kind of metal, which usually don't attract the youngest kids, who are those, who buy most records. But other reasons are labels that haven't pushed us enough, and not given us any proper tours.

- I would say that you are one of the bands, which I am familiar with, who have changed their style most drastically from album to album. Must every new record be different from the one before?

Yes, I always do what I feel like, and I will continue to do that. That is why I need Carbonized (Christofer's project-band, also featuring Lars from Entombed. -ed.) to express myself. I'm not only a musician, I'm an artist! To play live is fun, but creating music is what matters to me.

- "McDonalds feed their cows with our children's lives"!? Please explain exactly how they do that!

Come on! Why does everyone bother so much about what I did when I was 15-17 years old? I'm 22 now and create much more interesting lyrics to talk about! But ok, I'll answer your question, but in my own way. When you are a teenager, you are very rebellious against the grown ups' world. Society or whatever. Some lyrical writers show that by singing about Satan (the way Christianity looks upon it) in order to be extreme and schock people. Others write about pollution and political stuff. My rebellism was the last mentioned. What I meant with the lyrical line (from our first album) you mentioned was that McDonalds, by burning rainforests and plant grass for their cows, would help the end of new oxygenproduction, since the rainforest is delivering the main part. But if I should be honest with myslef, I didn't really care. I just thought that we were going to sell more records with that kind of lyrics, since it was very popular at that time. Nowadays, I don't give a fuck whether we sell records or not as long as I can create whatever kind of music I want, and release it.

- Är VIKINGARNA fortfarende Sveriges tuffaste band?

lngalunda, HERREYS var mycket ballare och ingen kommer någonsin att slå dem. De var ju kristna och hade guld-skor. Fy va' ballt! Jeg blir nästan rädd!

- How did you get the inspirations to create the original, orchestral parts on "Ho Drakon - Ho Megas"?

I don't know. That's just the kind of music I have in my head. But I must confess that I'm very influenced by the "Into The Pandemonium" by Celtic Frost. You will hear much more of that style on our new album.

- What are the lyrics on "Ho Drakon..." basically about? Is it some sort of a concept album?

The titletrack is an invocation of the Dragon as a symbol for the highest dark principle. It is written in Hebrew, ancient Egypt (Coptic), old Greek and Enokian. The two first tracks are also invocations, but the rest are just personal experiences. Visions and hails to certain important forces, except for "Symphoni Draconis Inferni", which is a ritual for a certain purpose (written in Latin).

- How is your record-deal nowadays? Will THERION still exist if you loose your deal?

As I mentioned earlier, we are now without a deal. But I think that's a positive thing, since that way we're able to get something better. Even though we are not the most well-selling band around, we are already an established band. And our sales are better than most other underground bands. Not many bands can sell 10.000 copies in Europe alone, without doing a tour. Also, I'd like to point out that a lot of labels are lying about their sales in order to get more attention. That is a part of promoting an album. Therion will exist until I don't have anymore inspiration to continue.

- Is your project-band, Carbonized, still going strong? Also, tell a little about the new album. It's very different from your debut, "The Security", isn't it?

Our "new" album is called "Disharmonization" and is now more than a year old. It's very different from our debut.

Our change of style is even more drastic than

Therion's. Piotr (Drums/Vocals) does most of the singing, and he has a normal voice - not growling! "Disharmonization" is a bit jazzy, very psychadellic piece of music.

The third album is already recorded, and it will be out in September/October (1994), and it is the ultimate psychadellic album! The title will be "Screaming Machine".

- How do you feel, if somebody say that they like your project-band, Carbonized, better than your "real" band, There

Why not? I know some people, who actually think that. It's a totally different kind of music and it is a matter of which taste to prefer.

- Last, but not least: Will Sweden join the EU, and do you have any last comments?

I don't know, but I hope so. If Finland vote yes, I guess the Swedes will be more inspired to do so as well.



CD-(dis)section

CEREMONIAL OATH (INTELLECTUAL CONVULSION)

I hate using the word trendy, but anyway, quite a few clones sounding very inspired by At The Gates, Dark Tranquility etc. have popped out lately, C.O. is one of them. Mix the abovementioned bands with American Immolation and you have the debut CD of C.O. Does anybody know where this one was recorded?? He..

KONKHRA "Sexual Affective Disorder" (PROGRESS)

Great return from Copenhagen based Konkhra. Their second CD, and way best release this far, has ten songs in the Death/Grind vein, and believe me, it's tight! The opening tune is very strong and powerful. Especially the highpitched vocals are worth noticing. The other songs haven't got excactly the same "touch" as the opening track, but they're not to be ignored! Nope, this one makes me proud of being Danish!

"CORPORATE DEATH - A.R.M.D." comp. (RELAPSE)

This CD represents the past, presence and future of American Relapse Records. From the industrializers in Candiru & Dead World to the grind celebrities A.C. and Repulsion not forgetting the messengers of death incl. Incantation and Suffocation. With a few exceptions this is rather high quality, varied, and indeed listenable. The CD comes with an informing and enjoyable 32 page booklet.

DARK TRANQUILLITY "Skydancer" (SPINEFARM)

At last, the debut album of D.T. is out. Understandable since they're pretty much one of a kind. The harmonic way which D.T. are playing DM has to be praised, and also the incredible guitarplaying. But I just have to mention that I only like D.T. in small doses, since you really have to concentrate to get the essence out of this complicated, harmonic guitarorientated. Bla. bla. bla.! Buy!

"HISTORY OF THINGS TO COME" comp. (GROWING DEAF)

Most compiltaions have good - and bad bands. Luckily, in this case, the good bands weight a lot more than the bad ones. I mean, just listening to the songs by Num Skull, Expulsion and Phantasm makes this CD worth the 20\$ it costs. Basically it can be said that the bands on this CD play old school Death Metal. Just check out the songs by the abovementioned and Dr. Shrinker, Matricide etc. A good comp. worth obtaining!

EDGE OF SANITY "The Spectral Sorrows" (BMP/PINGO)

Undoubtably, along with the MDB CD, this was the record of '93! Indeed a hymn to DM, the genre, which according to "everyone" is totally dead and gone - BAH! I don't reckon! Besides the outstanding cover of Manowar's "Blood Of My Enemies" and the gothic Sisters Of Mercy inspired "Sacrificed", this CD contains nothing but unbelivable, tight and listenable Death Metal. And it has an excellent thankslist aswell, ha ha! This is all you'll ever need... Buy!

CARCASS "Heartwork" CD+EP (EARACHE/PINGO)

What generally can be said about the evolution of CARCASS is that they have become "nicer", and as their current releases indicate: More polished. Sure, the new songs have some nice rhytms (it's still Death Metal though) and they are swinging well, but while listening to "Heartwork" I occasionally miss the charm which their first (nasty) albums had.

ANAL CUNT "Everyone Should Be Killed" (EARACHE/PINGO)

I'm a Grind Core fanatic, admitted. This hyperenergic "music" style attracts me, and it is - by my opinion 100% underground. So is A.C. - has always been - will always be, even though this CD is being released by a commercial label. Listening to A.C. is great fun, and neither their "music" nor lyrics can be taken serious. This is plain noisy entertainment - for devoted Grind Core fanatics only, I guess.

ENCHANTMENT "Dance The Marble Naked" (CENTURY MEDIA/PINGO)

I don't know why, but somehow the majority of the English metal bands seem to be playing Doom-Death. Enchantment is no exception. Earache have their Doom-kings (Cathedral), Peaceville have their Doom-kings (My Dying Bride) and now Century Media have their Doom-kings as well. Yes, the eight songs on this CD leave me totally satisfied, doomed. Indeed a beautiful release which deserves a lot of attention!

MY DYING BRIDE "Turn Loose The Swans" + "I Am The Bloody Earth" EP (PEACEVILLE)
I think it's quite unnecessary to introduce the ultimate Doom metal band, My Dying
Bride. Their "As The..." album is one of the very best albums ever. I've never heard
something as atmospheric and doomy before. This must be obtained!

Their newest release, "I Am The Bloody Earth" is a little different than "As The...", it contains 3 tunes (one remix of the classic "Crown Of Sympathy" and two new tunes) of which the first continues in their previous atmospheric style. The track entitled "Transcending" is very different from their previous material. It's more industrial and harder. Still it's got amosphere, and it sounds great. This should state it all: My Dying Bride are <u>THE</u> messengers of doom, a band that must be checked out - if you haven't done that already!

ROT "Cruel Face Of Life" (MORBID)

Brazilian Grind Corel? 42 songst? Yes, in both cases. Exciting!? Fresh!? No, in both cases. To put it simple, even G.C. can get too primitive and predictable, and Rot is a good example hereof. Two riffs, some fast drums and deep vocals is basically the ingredients of every song on this CD, which gets boring after the first listen..

SAMAEL "Ceremony Of Opposites" (CENTURY MEDIA/PINGO)

Samael are ok.. What I like about them is especially their live-set - and the fact that they're improving drastically from release to release. "Ceremony Of Opposites" is for sure their far best release this far, but still their fresh Black Metal occasionally suffer from the disease called monotony. But then again, we all know that it's quite impossible to make an album where all the songs are unique.

MYTHIC "Mourning In The Winter Solstice" EP (RELAPSE)

As I watch the MYTHIC bandphotos, I think I know why RELAPSE released this - and if they had put the bandphotos on a flyer, I'm sure it would sell good. Unfortunately their primitive sounding Doomy Death Metal doesn't have the same standard as the looks of the female members. In fact this CD is more or less boring - except for the bandphotos that is. Not really worth your bux, buy a "mag" instead.

CANNIBAL CORPSE "The Bleeding" (METAL BLADE/MIS. LABEL)

I've never been too fund of the Corpses. I've always thought that their music was too monotonous and straight-ahead. "The Bleeding" took me by surprise though, since it's a rather cool, varied experience. The music (and especially the vocals) have improved on all possible fields. That is what makes this well worth your money.

PUNGENT STENCH "Club Mundo Bizarre" (NUCLEAR BLAST/PINGO)

"Klyster Boogie", "I'm A Family Man" and "Fuck Bizarre" - I just love P.S. Their heavy, funny and perverse DM rules. P.S. is really a synonym for the phrase "sick". I mean, their music, lyrics, covers - yeah, in fact everything about them. "Club.." is basically a bit more midpaced and harsh/raw than their previous releases, and their new style suit them. Get a copy now!

NECROMANTIA "Crossing The Fiery Path" (OSMOSE/PINGO)

Osmose continues to sign one BM band after the other, unfortunately not all of them share the same standard. Necromantia are quite "cult" in the underground, but I'm not really sure why, since they're definately not as good as their countrymen Rotting Christ, Septic Flesh, Varathon etc. They're not as tight, wellsounding and wellplaying as the abovementioned. Actually this CD is rather weak, so buy something else instead.

GRAVE "...And Here I Die.. Satisfied" EP + "Soulless" (CENTURY MEDIA/PINGO)

Grave has as far as I recall always been a very powerful band in my ears. Until now! The mini-CD has 4 old songs and only 2 new. Somehow the 3 songs recorded in '90 are far the best - and most powerful. They sound like Grave! The '86 re-recording and the 2 new songs sound more like a cheap and vague copy of the previous recordings. Fortunately, "Soulless" states Grave as what they are, powerful. Back in the old (usual) style, thank God!

TORTURER "Oppressed By The Forces" (INFEST)

It's certainly not every day you get a CD with a band from Chile. I reckon Torturer are oppressed by something, since this CD sounds like a protest, sort of "fuck you" thing. Really furious Thrash-Death. Occasionally comparable to the <u>old</u> Morbid Angel 'era". The lead guitar is really in focus here, a fact that makes the entire album sound a little uncontrolled at times.

IMMORTAL "Pure Holocaust" (OSMOSE/PINGO)

Immortal play Black, very Black Metal. This album is not as well-produced as their debut, but it sure is faster and more wild/uncontrolled. A thing which I appreciate by Immortal is their guitarriffs, which are both harmonic and wildsounding at the same time. A release worth obtaining if you're into B.M.

DISGORGED "Thy Hideous Wake" EP (SELF FINANCED)

After having listened to this one carefully a dozen of times, my main impression is that it's a <u>heavy</u> thing. Disgorged stick to the brutal American way of playing Death Metal, showing no sign of weakness or originality here. I think these 17 min. are ok, so get a copy from Disgorged, P.O. Box 153, Rochester, NY. 14624, U.S.A.

IMPALED NAZARENE "Ugra-Karma" (OSMOSE/PINGO)

Unfortunately the second album from these Finnish Black-heads isn't half as strong and powerful as their debut. It's like they've begun to repeat themselves. They grind (tight) and handle their instruments well, but only the song called "The Horny And The Homed" really makes a big impression. The rest sounds more or less like a black chaos.

FLESHCRAWL "Impurity" (BLACK MARK)

This is Death Metal with a big O. O for being ordinary! Fleshcrawl is a German band sounding Swedish. Maybe this has to do with the fact that the album was recorded in Sweden's Unisound studio?! The $(2\frac{1}{2}$ sec. long) intro is killer, but otherwise it sounds like the band is running out of good ideas after 2-3 songs. A shame, I thought that their 7", which was released years ago, was promising.

NAPALM DEATH "Fear, Emptiness, Despair" (EARACHE/PINGO)

The presskit says that long-time grinders, Napalm Death, are back in their <u>old</u> vein. Not really! Soundwise, yes - but certainly not musicalwise. This isn't really much faster than "Harmony C." or "Utopia B.". As I said before, the <u>sound</u> is really Grind Core orientated and that is the charm of the album. Old fans will like it, but I don't think that N.D. will make any new fans with this one.

ROTTREVORE "Iniquitous" (DROWNED/HARD VINYL)

I've never been too fund about Rottrevore, and again that is the case, I'm afraid. Their muddy, heavy and primitive sound hasn't really improved throughout the last years. Their way of playing DM is simply too uninspiring. Perhaps if "Iniquitous" had been released in '88... Well, this is '94 you know!?

EUCHARIST "A Velvet Creation" (WRONG AGAIN)

I must admit that I'd expected more of Eucharist after their very successful demo. Theyre clearly showing their skills as musicians, but the sound/production doesn't do them any justice. It's kinda thrashy while their music still is strongly Black/Death orientated. I'm quite sure that their next CD will be their brake-through, since this one isn't.

SKELETON OF GOD "Urine Garden" EP (SELF FINANCED)

S.O.G. are sick! I don't know what these guys are on, but their music is "acid" and "stoned" sounding. Really sick, and weird at times. S.O.G. manage to control their brutal, heavy Death/Grind with 100% psychadellic parts, and as a matter of fact, it mostly ends up sounding cool. P.O. Box 156, Nederland, CO. 80466, U.S.A.

CREMATORY "...Just Dreaming" (MASSACRE)

What first hit me about this was the great graphic designs/cover. Secondly that the music was much better than I'd expected. Crematory has a permanent keyboardplayer, and that is both positive and negative due to the fact that some of it sounds cool while other sounds bad. Mostly it turns out good, and has a positive affect on their already recomendable Death Metal. Sure, this is worth a buy!

ASPHYX "Asphyx" (CENTURY MEDIA/PINGO)

I've never really understood why Asphyx has a deal.. As far as I recall, all their releases are boring + rather primitive. Their new album is no exception - the same old predictable <u>primitive</u> Doomy Death as always. The only thing which makes me listen to it are the great vocals. What the fuck is the vocalist doing in Asphyx?

GODSEND "As The Shadows Fall" (HOLY)

Haven't I heard this before? Godsend are 100% pure Doom Metal, strongly inspired by (old) Cathedral and Black Sabbath. That is heavy guitars, singing vocals and simple drumplaying. Too bad that Godsend hasn't got the same swing to its music as (newer) Cathedral for instance. That lack makes this album kind of boring in the long run.

PYOGENESIS "Waves Of Erotasia" EP (NUCLEAR BLAST/PINGO)

You probably can't imagine how happy I was when I found the new masterpiece from Pyogenesis in my mailbox. I still am happy to have recieved it since Pyogenesis are continuing to play their surperb and original Death/Doom. Only failure is the last song which is supposed to be an acoustic DM song - ha! Avoid that one. The rest of the songs make this one worth your money.

THE RICHIES "Pet Summer" (WE BITE)

What has happened to The Richies? Their last mini-CD was incredibly great (punk-rock), but now, their new CD is out and things have obviously changed. For the worse that is. They've lost the(ir) power and energy. Instead they are now playing some sort of depressing-sounding (punk-rock), which turns out very monotonous after a few songs, Buy their killer EP, "Don't Wanna Know If You Are Lonely" instead.

EXPULSION "A Bitter Twist Of Fate" EP (SELF FINANCED)

After I had heard Expulsions's unique appearance on the "History..." comp. CD, I became very interested to hear more of their material. Dealing with this mini-CD, you still can hear that it's Expulsion, but the 3 songs haven't got the same catchiness as their unique song on the comp. CD. Still, this is definately around average I'd say. Contact Midgårdsv. 12. 2tr, 183 74 Täby, Sweden.

G.W.A.R. "Scumdogs Of The Universe" (ARMAGEDON/SPV)

This one is a classic, so if you haven't grapped a copy yet - get a copy of this rerelease. "S.O.T.U." is definately the best G.W.A.R. album. Funny, funky, rocking, but still metal.. Songs like "Sick Of You" and "Slaughterama" remind me of their killershows..

ABSU "Barathrum: V.I.T.R.I.O.L." (OSMOSE/PINGO)

Absu has always had an occult touch to their music. They play Death/Grind with strong BM influences. Sounds ok actually, except for the silly operasinging vocals. As for the real vocals, they're real BM orientated (screamy), and it also the vocals which give the music the Black touch. The (drum) sound could have been better, but that shouldn't stop you from investing some \$ in this.

LAWNMOVER DETH "BIIIY" (EARACHE/PINGO)

One, two, three, four - ha-ha-ha-happy Hard Core! Already frightened? Just wait till you hear the music, my description suits L.D. perfectly. Right now this isn't my cup of tea, but perhaps in 50 years when I'm retired...

"MIDWEST METALFEST" comp. (GROUND ZERO)

This one is too outdated. An entire CD recorded live at a metal festival in 1990. The band repetoire is varied, but none of the bands (Nightmare, Simon Sez, Terakil, Thanatopsis etc.) are outstanding or interesting. I'd only invest money in this if I knew some of the bandmembers personally.

MEAT SHITS "Ecstasy Of Death" (MORIBUND)

"Yes, you have a great body - may I use it?"! The Meat Shits! The 55 "songs" and a million intros (all stolen from mis. (pomo) movies) are.. Extreme! What's a little annoying about Meat Shits are the length of the songs. Sure, short songs are cool, but 3 sec. songs get annoying if they appear too often. During the short songs Meat Shits manage to mix elements from DM with pure Grind and Industrial. All in all, this CD is both good and bad, but buy it anyway since it's nevertheless funny! The Picture-Disc design really rules.

AT THE GATES "With Fear I Kiss The Burning Darkness" (DEAF)

The debut CD from A.T.G. was a true mindblower, while this, their second CD doesn't really reach the high standards, the band had on their debut. Especially the vocalsit has lost energy. Sure, this one is technical and A.T.G. are good musicans, but this album just hasn't got the same "spark" as their last one.

MORPHEUS "Son Of Hypnos" (STEP ONE)

Swedish Morpheus has been around for some years, so I thought that this (their second) CD would be interesting. But it's not. Infact the 10 songs of thrashy mid-paced DM are utterly boring. It's like the band hasn't really got the power/strenght which is necessary for a DM band, and therefore my advice is to ignore this one.

ENCHANT "A Blueprint Of The World" (DREAM CIRCLE)

I don't think Enchant can be put in the metal-catagory at all. No, their music is soft, progressive Rock. The kind of music, which easily could hit the major charts, if it was promoted the right way. Not my kind of music.

ANCIENT RITES "The Diabolic Seranades" (AFTER DARK)

The Belgian purveyors of Black mayhem are back. This time with a CD which unlike many other Black Metal releases has a good and thick sound, and the(ir) songs are tight played. Even though the musical arrangements aren't the most technical, A.R. has got "something" to their music - an occult and fascinating atmosphere. Do order this CD for 18\$ right away!

SADIST "Above The Light" (NOSFERATU)

Nice guitarplaying! Yep, with this CD Italian Sadist manage to convince me that they're one of the very best Italian bands. First of all their (Death Metal) music is <u>varied</u> and secondly it's <u>not</u> predictable at all. Ok, it's not the best album ever, but one of the best to come out of southern Europe lately.

ATHEIST "Elements" (METAL BLADE)

Let's just make one thing clear: This is one of the most technical albums I've ever heard. But somehow being hyper-technical just isn't enough. I can't seem to find any catchiness whatsoever in any of the elements here. Invest your money in this one if you wanna hear some good musicans brag about themselves only!

MORDICUS "Dances From The Left" (INFEST/THRASH)

Let it hereby be stated that the Scandinavian scene is as strong as never before! Norway is representing the Black side, while Denmark, Sweden, Finland and also Iceland continue to spit forth new Death Metal releases. The debut CD of Mordicus has, like many other Scandinavian bands, a quite high standard. Taste the Scandinavian Death an order this CD from Infest Rec.!

BANISHED "Deliver Me Unto Pain" (DEAF)

This one surely breathes fresh air into the somehow crowded DM scene. The four brave Americans delivering this 12 song fucker have done a good job, and I'm sure that this one is gonna make some heads swing (atleast mine does)! Oh yeah, disgusting cover! P.S. Banished was formerly called Baphomet if that should rang a bell..?

OCCULT "Prepare To Meet Thy Doom" (FOUNDATION 2000/NORDIC)

Occult are mixing wellproduced, melodic Death Metal with desperate Black Metal howls. And that sounds cool. In fact it's a shame that there are so few vocals on this CD. Try and check it out anyway.

MISANTHROPE "Miracles: Totem Taboo" (HOLY)

This weird, avantgarde kind of thing could as well had been a soundtrack - or a part of a musical. At times it's depressing, other times it's jazzy, classical or doomy and sometimes it's even theatrical. Very weird, and very original.

GENETIC WISDOM "Humanity On Parole" (MASCOT/NORDIC)

If angry, non-compromizing, heavy Thrash-Core is your style, G.W. could easily become one of your fave bands as they handle that genre very well. Also, everyone into Death or Thrash ought to give it a listen as it's got plenty with power and energy.

GOREAPHOBIA "Omen Of Masochism" EP (RELAPSE)

I reviewed the band's 7" back in # 1, and since 2 of the three songs are from the 7", I'll just conclude that it still is a godly piece of disgusting Death. The new song is more in the Black Metal vein, and that's a shame since Goreaphobia's way of playing DM really is (was?) sublime.

DÅY HØUSTEN "Sun Øf A New Dåy" (WE BITE)

D.H. is the kind of alternative, dirty "Rock" band, which must be experienced live at some smelly, sweathy club (who said Paranoid?). I bet they're ok live, but this CD gets boring too quick. Live, live, live music!

MANGLED TORSOS "Drawings Of The Dead" (MORBID)

Sure, this had to be released on Morbid Records. They're really going for the early Carcass type of bands. With their clear sound and varied music, M.T. are much better than their label mates Dead Infection and Rot. In fact I'm convinced that M.T. is the best band on Morbid Rec. this. A step in the right direction.

"IN THE NAME OF SATAN" comp. (GUN/MIS. LABEL)

Incredibly! This is the 2. tribute album to Venom to be reviewed in this issue. Where as the first ("Promoters...") featured underground acts only, this one features "wellknown" bands only. It's funny to hear and compare the different bands versions, for instance Voivod's "In League With Satan" (feat. on this one) to Deranged's version (feat. on "Promoters..."), they sure are different. Fans of Venom, Kreator, Anathema, Nuclear Assault, Skyclad, Sodom, Paradise Lost etc. should invest some money in this.

ALTAR "Youth Against Christ" (DISPLEASED)

The more I listen to to Dutch Altar, the more I like them. Their straight-ahead Death-Thrash-Grind, which is a little like Deicide's, is actually cool and varied. And not to forget - brutal. Yep, if you're into brutal music, you shouldn't miss this one.

MERCYFUL FATE "The Bell Witch" EP (METAL BLADE/MIS. LABEL)

Featuring the best material (2 studio \pm 4 live songs) by this cult act, this is their best release this far. The live songs are so scary, and King's vocals are better than ever. No doubt, this is a classic!

DETEST "Dorval" (PROGRESS)

To be honest, I'd expected this CD to be a little better. Detest obviously have potential, as well as musical abillities. But I don't think that Detest should have slowed down. "Doval" is in the Death/Doom vein where their demo was more thrashy (and charming). Since the release of "Doval" there have been several line-up changes, and judging from the new material that I heard with them, their new material shreds!

THE ORGANIZATION "Same" (METAL BLADE)

This is the once so wellknown Death Angel. Shortly: Those who liked Death Angel will like The Organization as well, and those who didn't like D.A. won't like The O. either.

THE SPUDMONSTERS "Stop The Madness" (MASSACRE)

If this isn't M.O.D., you can call me... Eh.. I better watch out what I'm saying. But honestly this sounds exactly like M.O.D. It's just the fact that this cross-over thing is so god-damned wellplayed. It's totally unoriginal, but still good.

TIAMAT "The Sleeping Beauty - Live in Israel" EP (CENTURY MEDIA/PINGO)

Sometimes you really get dissapointed when you hear a live-recording with a band whose studiorecording you adored. Luckily this is NOT the case with Tiamat! They sound like they did the two times I've heard them live, great that is! Their live-sound is (of course) a bit more raw than their studiosound, but it really fits their amtospheric gothic-sounding metal. Don't miss this one!

OBITUARY "World Demise" (ROADRUNNER/MIS. LABEL)

Old Obituary fans will not be dissapointed with this one as it definately is the band's best release this far. But since I've never been too big a fan of Obituary's music, which in my ears is a little too predictable and straight ahead, this doesn't give me a hardon. Still, the way John Tardy screams his obituary is frightening...

MURPHYS LAW "Good For Now" EP (WE BITE)

Once again We Bite states that happy Punk'n roll isn't dead?! Happy, moving, punkish... Cool & different actually. The EP only lasts 12 min., but then again it doesn't get boring.

"EXTREME CLOSE-UP" comp. (MNW/CLOSE-UP)

Close-Up is a Swedish-written, professional magazine, which is extremely hard when it comes to judging/reviewing bands. But this CD, which they ahve put together is absolutely nothing to yell about. Overflash, Vermin and Katatonia are all great, but the other bands, well... Byrgghrighth should say it all.

MACHINE HEAD "Burn My Eyes" (ROADRUNNER/MIS. LABEL)

M.H. is undoubtably the heaviest Thrash act, I've ever heard. The extremely heavy production by Colin Richardson (Gorefest etc.) does along with the varied song-writing, featuring elements from Industrial, Power and Death Metal, make "Burn My Eyes" an extremely interesting piece of music. Must be obtained!

NIGHTFALL "Macabre Sunsets" (HOLY)

Nightfall, the Greek band, have now completed their 2. album. On "Macabre Sunsets" the band is mixing elements from classical music, Doom Metal and Rotting Christ type of bands. That particular mixture does mostly turn out good, but at times also a little confusing.

MALEVOLENT CREATION "Stillborn" (ROADRUNNER/MIS. LABEL)

The third album from M.C. is like the others a strong piece of fastplayed Death Metal. The drummer is amazingly good. Too bad that not all the songs on "Stillborn" have the charm that so many of their previous. Still, "Stillborn" is not to miss.

DEPRAVITY "Silence Of The Centuries" (ADIPOCERE)

Depravity start off exactly where they stopped with their splendid '93 promotape. If you are not formerly familiar with the band, I'll just say that they play Death Metal with room for both harmony and brutality. It's the way Depravity mix brutality with harmony that make them interesting. I only wish Depravity would improve a little more, and bring their music to an even higher level. 12\$ from P.O. Box 60, 33961 Pirkkala, Finland.

CONSOLATION/NEMBRIONIC HAMMERDEATH split (DISPLEASED)

The first band on this split, Consolation kick some serious ass. Their music is intelligent, very angry-sounding Grind/Death. N.H.'s Death Metal isn't even half as good. They really sound like a demoband, especially their sound is very primitive. Buy this split because of Consolation's contributions!

ILLDISPOSED "Return From Tomorrow" EP (PROGRESS)

I'm having a much harder time getting as hooked on this one than I had with their debut. Especially the vocals sound too unreal at times. Illdisposed still is high-quality, violent Death Metal, and this EP is not to miss, I'd just expected more.

SEPTIC FLESH "Mystic Places Of Dawn" (HOLY)

I never thought that someone would be able to mix classical music with technical Death Metal - and get away with it this well. S.F. succeeded since "Mystic.." is a highly recomendable piece of original and listenable music.

"VOCIFEROUS & MACHIAVELIAN HATE" comp. (EVIL OMEN/OSMOSE)

This CD simply has too many intros! In fact it has more intros than songs. 4 bands contribute to this CD, and it lasts 76 min. Mythos with their fast Death/Grind are best, but the other contributors: Expulsion, Unexpected and Mysthical are also noteworthy, and so is this comp.

THE LAST THINGS "Circles And Butterflies" (NORDIC)

The style of The Last Things is Progressive Heavy Metal. All the members are good musicians and all songs are at a high technical level, but unlike many other Progressive Metal bands, their music is not too technical, so you can actually listen to this without being confused.

DISMEMBER "Indecent & Obscene" (NUCLEAR BLAST

Unlike most other bands, time has not been on Dismember's side. Since the release of their debut, "Like An...", things have gone downhill for Dismember, both music - and soundwise. On "Indecent..." they're just repeating themselves. This is boring Swedish DM!

CREEPMINE "Shadows" (MASCOT/NORDIC)

Creepmine's problem is that their otherwise wellplayed Death Metal always turns out the way you expect it will, so there are no surprises here. Instead of being something special, Creepmine's debut is "just" an average album.

SCORN "Evanescence" (EARACHE/PINGO)

I seriously don't hope or think that this will sell at all. If somebody, by mistake, should happen to obtain a copy of this (shit), they'll get 63 min. of boting (ambient) Industrial with no balls or power at all. Just confusing and annoying!

ENTOMBED "Out Of Hand" EP (EARACHE/PINGO)

This excellent EP contains three tracks, 1 taken from the band's brilliant "Wolverine Blues", and two cover-tunes of Kiss and Repulsion being performed by Entombed, with their own charm, sound and catchiness. If you like any of three bands, but most of all Entombed, you should get this.

ISENGARD "Vinterskugge" (DEAF/PEACEVILLE)

Isengard, which is a project of Fenriz from Dark Throne, indicate that Black Metal can be original. Isengard mix a traditional BM sound, playing and screaming with some "normal" singing vocals now and then. Unfortunately 9 of the 16 songs are from '89 and '91, and they're not as wellplayed as the 7 newest tunes.

DIABOLIC POSSESSION "Ripped To Pieces" EP (GROUND ZERO)

"Ripped..." is a raw piece of evil and ripping Death Metal. The vocals are real scaring and as a matter of fact, they are the coolest element in D.P.'s music. Being an EP, this is ok, but it doesn't reach the same heights as "album-quality".

JACKAL "Vague Visions" (RISING SUN/MIS. LABEL)

I really dig this CD! It contains music by the good old speedy recipe, and it has resemblance to Iron Maiden. "Vague Visions" include a great instrumental song, "2001", which I just love. And if that wasn't enough, the album is also stewed with some harder elements. Buy this sucker! (PM)

BENEDICTION "The Grotesque - Ashen Epitaph" EP (NUCLEAR BLAST/PINGO)

Five songs of which 2 are new (studiorecordings) and the three others being liverecordings of older material. Benediction... Will these guys go on forever, delivering the same recognizable bobti-bobti alike DM? They've got a new drummer now, but don't worry, Benediction sound exactly like they always have. Come on lads, progress! Try!

UTUMNO "Across The Horizon" (CENOTAPH)

Utumno's debut 7" was one helluva piece of vinyl. But it seems that instead of developing their own fresh style, they've now chosen the more normal, "Swedish" style. In fact they've ended up sounding like a copy of a mixture of Afflicted & Desultory.

WATCHTOWER "Energetic Dissembly" (I.O.A./NORDIC)

8 years after the release of "Energetic...", I.O.A. Rec. decided to re-release on CD. Yep, this is the famous Watchtower. They are legendary to some, well, I think "Energetic..." is "laughandary", ha ha. This doesn't belong in '94. Besides, Watchtower have improved a lot since the release of "Energetic...", so I guess this a collectors item..

MISERY LOVES CO. Private Hall ER (MNW)

This is strange. An attracting and very original cambination of Power Metal and Industrial I'd say. Not monotonous at all, Definately on P for your collection.

'ANTICHRIST SUPERSTAR' comp. (DISPLEASED)
Since the cover/lay-out here is in toe: In upon the music would have the same, high standard. But that is not quite the case, secrets of Hybernoid and 2 Minutes Hate, none of the bands are original. Daher, Affermath AD and Hanniball are totally out-dated (boring), but fortunately excision, Mystic Charm and Damnation are much better. But to be honest - there are better complications available.

EXIT-13 "Don't Spare The Green Love" (RELAPSE)

I'd heard a lot about Exit-13, and I was looking forward to this one. It contains 25 songs, taken from their previously released efforts, two 7'es and a LP. Does it live up to the high expectations then? No! The music is quite welrd, messy jazz Death perhaps?! This is not the kind of record I get addicted to.

FETISH 69 "Brute Force" EP (INTELLECTUAL CONVULSION)

Here we have a dose of heavy-like-hell-raw-metal mixed with industrial vibes. Like most other industrial bands, some of their parts turn out good while others don't. Still, Fetish 69 (funny name by the way) are one of the best industrial bands around. A new CD should be out on NBR now.



BURZUM

This splendid interview is done by Steve O'Malley from DESCENT Magazine, which hails from the states.. I'd like to thank Steve O'Malley for letting me use this interview in NAGUAL. Hail brother!! BURZUM is the spawn of the infamous Varg Vikernes, also known to some as Count Grishnackh. BURZUM's releases so far include a demotape (1991), "Burzum" debut album (1992), "Aske" mini-LP (1992), "Det Som Var En Gang" album (1993), and "Hvis Lyset Tar Oss" album (1994). BURZUM/Count Grishnackh are at the current moment a wellknown band/person, but the reason for the fame is at least as much due to accusations of church-burnings, theft, gravedesecrations, racist utterings and a 1st degree murder-charge...

- Ok, let's dive right into it... You have informed me in your letters that you are an Odinist. I am curious, when you first heard of Odinism did you have an immediate attraction to it?

My heathendom is and has always been within me. Odinism is not a fixed religion; it's a way of life I have been living, though, not always conscious of it. My heathen consciousness didn't come over a short period of time. Such things develop slowly.

- You're a man of pure Viking blood. Why were you misled by Satanism and occult subjetcs for so long? It seems as Odinism would hit closer to home, wouldn't it?

I have never been misled by Satanism nor Occultism; heathendom is both. Odin is my father, and he is an opponent of the Christian "God". In Hebrew, "Satan" means opponent. Thus is Odin Satan. The one-eyed Satan of the North. That makes me a satanist as I follow my father. If you study my symbolism, you find Kakenkreuz (Swastika) and the one eye. No pentagrams nor any inverted crosse that so many people believe is Satanism. Maybe it is, but not for me, I am a Northman with symbols of the North. Alas, for many of them are hidden.

- You have been a target of many accusations of Nazism. What does the Swastika mean to you? What do you have to say to these accursers?

They manifest their lack of knowledge about me and my symbolism. Also, usually the same people haven't the slightest idea of what Nazism is really about, so how can they tell if I am a Nazi or not? I really don't care about what people say or call me. I am what I am. A true Northman. Nothing can change that. The Swastika is the hammer of Thor, cleaving through all darkness of matter. The mightiest weapon. With it, we shall crush the skull of the Christian "God" and his inept people. Alas, I am no Nazi! I am a white Aryan Odionist. Call me whatever you want I shall only stand proud.

- Do you see and feel a real tension building up from within the Norse people, especially the young, against modern Christianized society and government? When do you think this tension will snap and what will be the results, Varg?

I know not what will happen. But indeed, there is a tension building up within us Norsemen. The fall of "God" and his effete people is at hand. The re-conquest has

begun. We will win or die in the attempt. The war against the forsakers of Odin has begun. Scandinavia is OURS!

- In your letters, you asked me why no one ever asks about the "outer" (Black Metal) circle. Okay, who were the "outer" circle and what was their purpose (in regard to the "inner" leadership)?

What I meant was that all Norwegian Black Metal bands get the title of "inner circle band". Obviously, they can't be! For would it



then be an inner circle if over two dozen bands are part of it? The inner circle is the trinity of the kings: all other are "outer circle" bands. The kings are the three first. Demonaz of IMMORTAL, Fenriz of DARK-THRONE, and Grishnackh of BURZUM!

- What has become of these members since Euronymous' death? Has the unity been lost, or have they been split up in many factions? Euronymous' death was nothing but timely and gain for us. The unit is both weakened and strengthened. We have lost the weak and strengthened the rest. If anybody rebels against our rule, we will crush them.
- It seems Euronymous' death sent out a spark which lit an inferno of new, black, pagan grups (Gorgoroth, Manes, Hades, etc.) in Norway. Where do such groups stand in your opinion?

All the bands you mentioned here started up a long time before the death of the Red Rat. I wonder why the hell people believe Norway cares about his death? We had jokes about him as early as '91! "Funeral Fag" and such. (Perversion of the song title Funeral Fog of Mayhem). He was a fucking faggot! Euronymous died in his fucking underwear trying to run away from his killer(s), screaming like a fucking hysterical woman. (The Police

told me, he he). I think that was proof enough of him being a wimp! A real man would have died fighting, not running away. Survival to the fittest. Well, back to the question. I ignore all bands but those who support me. Them I support, no matter when they were formed.

- I see a great amount of similarity at times between your music and classical music. Do you have an appreciation and interest in this style of music?

The similarity is the monotonusness which is present in Burzum and classical music, but also the melancholy. Still, I'm not particularly into classical music. Some Grieg and Tchaikovsky, but little else. The monotonousness and melancholy of Burzum is mainly from acts as modern electronic music, like Software, When, and underground techno.

 Why have you kept Burzum primarily a oneman effort instead of expanding into a full band?

I'm egolistical, intolerant, individualistic, and have some bad habits. Like ending up in jail from time to time. As a one-man band, I can continue any way.

- A while back, the news of the church burnings in your country began to spread throughout the scene. What do you think the purpose of doing this was? Do you really believe that this would start a war with Christianity?

Imagine the U.S. if one percent of all churches were burned. That is what happened in Norway. A dozen churches in Norway is one percent. What would happen if one thousand churches burned in the U.S.? That's about one percent, right? It might not be a state of war, but indeed, it's a clear statement of what somebody doesn't like. All wars have a different scale. Our war is not as noticeable as a war between nations, still it's war. The situation in Norway is as if thousand churches had burned in the U.S... DESPAIR!

- Do you have any last words?

Strife is evolution. Peace is degeneration. Make war, not love.

Fallen Angel - Helheim

As it's my opinion that Fallen Angel are one of the hottest and very best Danish bands, well actually, one the best unsigned European bands, I had Erik, whose drumplaying has to be heard to be believed, to stop by the office to tell the latest news and why the change of monicker. It's the 9th of August, 1994, and after studying my original copy of Saxo Grammaticus, new sagas were unveiled...

Well Erik, Fallen Angel are now changing name.. Why Helheim?

It's pretty simple really. We're not satanists as our old monicker might have indicated. To the uninitiated, Helheim is "Hell" in the Norse Mythology. Helheim is the old word for the Danish phrase "Heksekeddel". There's a Hellheim near where we live, where people used to sacrifice (blote) to Hel.

- So you're really serious about the "new" concept - and name? You're not just jumping on the bandwagon saying the "We are evil, we are Black, we are Vikings" ("We wanna sell many records) thing?

I'd rather say that we are jumping OFF the bandwagon! When we had a Satanic image.. Well, we weren't really into it.. Since my childhood, I've been very much into my heathenish past. By the way, we ARE evil, we ARE vikings. There is one major difference between us and satanists. Satanists are pathetic since they worship their God the same way as the Christians worship their God, only they are a contrast, of course.

- Have there been as drastic changes musically as lyrically and concept-wise, or is your music still the same <u>Hell</u>lish Grind/Death?

Drastic perhaps.. The riffs are different, but you can still hear it's us. The vocals will mainly be screaming, howling..

- I have to interrupt you. Are you going Black Metal or what? All the ingredients seem to be present now..? I don't know how to label our music. We're trying to create the same atmosphere and the concept is almost the same, but our music is not primitive or untight.
- Det ondeste navn du kender!?

- What is most important to you: Succes, groupies and big money or dark woods and Saxo Grammaticus?

It's a mixture of it all, I'd say. I hate bands who say that they don't wanna gonna commercial. Saying that is commercial! I don't need the groupies (Hef Julie! -ED.), but succes, big money, dark woods and Saxo Grammaticus are all favourites of mine.

- All your songs seem to be extremely fast, how about some heavy parts now and then in order to vary your music and make it less 'wild'?

That's a good question. That's our "mark". We don't have any lazy parts at all. Our music must be as intense as possible.

- Don't you think that it can be a problem in a live-situation when only being a 3-piece-band? I mean, where (who) is the frontman then? Wouldn't it be cooler if the strings could concentrate a little more on playing/controlling the grindparts - and headbang? There's no frontman in Helheim. So far we're a triangle. It can be a problem in the new songs, where the bass and guitars go different rhythms all the time. But both (Martin & Thomas) are good vocalists. We'll probably get an extra member some day.

- Which of your so far only two releases have been most wellrecieved by the fans and the undergroundpress? The new one, I suppose?

Definately the new! The old one, "An Omen Of Apocalypse", was very well-recieved out of Denmark, especially in the U.S.A. So far the new one hasn't

recieved any bad critics. The only problem is that it sells like Hell.

- I heard that you signed to RP Records for a 7*EP, you did record it, but what then?

Then we never heard from them again.

- So they ripped you off?

Yeah, and unfortunately we can't get a hold of the guy who runs it, but an American band we know, has promised to beat the shit out off him!

- Is that the way a rip-off should be treated?

No, he should have had his loungs torned out the old

no, ne snould have had his loungs forned out the of heathenish way...

- Is RP Records your only bad experience from the underground?

I think so. We sent him 20 demos, recorded the 7", paid the studio-costs ourselves, sent him the mastertape, lay-out etc. Vi skal nok få fat på ham...

- So, instead of a 7", you released the recorded songs as a promotape

Yeah, we decided to release it as a tape instead, with the hopes of getting a new deal.. We've also thought about releasing one ourselves. I think that the two only underground labels that really would suit us, which would be the ultimate for us, are French Osmose Prod. and American Moribund Records...

- What do you personally listen to when you're not performing or creating music yourself?


Classical stuff.. Symphonies, ballets etc. And at the moment, I listen to a lot of Black Metal: Dark Throne & Immortal. But my inspirations change. I always listen to Classical Music though.

- If you were going to do a soundtrack for any movie you would like, what kind of movie would that be, and who would be playing the the female-maincharacter-role?

It should definately be a historical movie about the old Scandinavian times. The Bronze-age. Your little sister, Line, would be perfect for the female-main-character-role. A long/light-haired, Scandinvian-looking Valkyre!!

- You've got a train to catch, and the got several hours of sleep to catch, so..

METALIZED Magazine + Records:

I believe that Metalized has been around as long as loanremember, to those who didn't know, Metalized is the biggest Danish-witten Metal-magazine, and it's also a recordshop, based in Copenhagen. I'm not lying when I say that every metal-fan in Denmark knows Metalized.

Metalized was started back in '87. At that time there were a few other magazines, but they faded away. Orlainally, mainmen Mika Bofeldt and Jakob Schultz took care of everything, but a staff was soon recruited. The shop on the other hand saw the light of day in '90. Metalized Magazine is so far responsible for 19 (!) issues, of which the 10 latest are rather prof. and come with coloured covers etc. When I asked Mika, if the were plans about releasing the magazine every second/third month, he said that they were seriously aiming towards that. The printrun has been around 3500 copies, but Mika doesn't think that it can be any better/bigger. Metalized isn't available in either Sweden or Norway, even though the language is almost the same. In Denmark, Metalized is available in almost every shop that sells magazines, and the distribution is really good. But Metalized hasen't been able to sell the idea to the major Swedish or Norwegian distribution-services. At the current moment, Metalized Magazine puts the focus on the harder/brutal edge of the genre because of it's growing popularity. "It sells", Mika admits. And he continues "There will always be some kids who like the brutal stuff". Metalized has got a "Glam-section" which is loved/nated by many, but Mika believes that It's an important part of the magazine. According to Mika, the people who buy Metalized listen to different kinds of (Metal) music. Metalized has and will always be Danish-written. I asked Mika how he thinks the Danish scene will develope within the next years, and he answered "It developes all the time. Bands come and come and go all the time. It can't get any harder thought, he admits some new magazines have also popped out lately, but Mika doesn't see any of them as serious competetors. Metalized has been around for many years, and it looks like they'll continue.

NORDIC METAL

Is Mikats own recordiabel. Nordic Metal mainly signs/ releases bands playing Progressive Metal, like The Last Things and Lord Bane, But Nordic Is also releasing/ distributing releases from labels like Institute Of Art, Mascot and Foundation 2000 in Denmark.

Mika had thought about starting his own label a long time ago, since he believed he had some good contacts and that there were many cool bands around with a lot of potential. So far, Nordic Metal's releases are selling ok, but Mika hopes that Nordic, and its bands will get a serious brake-through soon. I asked Mika, which of his releases he considered to be his best, and he said "Well, the Lord Bane CD is due for release... And It's the BEST (Progressive) Metal record EVER!!"...

Pungent Stench is a band, which has always been a little different from all other extreme bands. Both their music and covers have always had a very sick touch. The band's latest release, "Club Mondo Bizarre" really is a noteworthy, raw and almost original release. Therefore, I had this conversation with "El Cochino" himself when the band visited Denmark...

- SO, WIE GEHTS UND STEHTS?

Good! The tour started one week ago, and the response has been really cool. Right now we're enjoying the whole thing.

- HOW DO YOU DANCE "KLYSTER BOOGIE"?

You will see tonight.. He he... (Believe me, it's a strange kind of "dancing"! -ed.)

- WHAT IS SO COOL ABOUT WEARING ALL THESE SADOMASOCHISTIC CLOTHES? IS IT JUST FOR THE FUN, OR ARE YOU REALLY INTO IT?

We know people in that "scene". I just like to see stuff like that.. I think it's a very strong image, and it fits the new CD perfectly since it's a concept album. And the club where we did the photos.. Well, it was just a nice (???? -ed.) place. Good people there, and they told me some weird stoires... The club where we shot the photos is not called "Club Mondo Bizarre", but "Das Internat" instead

- I NOTICED SOME SPANISH INFLUENCES ON YOUR NEW CD, LIKE SONGTTILES ETC...

I don't know. You know, Martin (bass) has learned a lot of Spanish, and we like the language, it's a funny language. The titles just sound cool in Spanish.

- DID YOU KNOW THAT THERE IS A DANISH BAND CALLED IDIOSYNCRASY WHO HAS BEEN PERFORMING A COVER-VERSION OF YOUR "SPLATTERDAY NIGHT FEVER", A LONG TIME BEFORE YOU INVENTED THIS KAROOKEE THING?

No, I didn't know.. But I would very much like to hear their version!! About the Karookee competition, we've done, so far we've recieved 4 tapes. 3 tapes from Rumania and only one from Vienna. But we hope to recieve a whole lot more!

- YOUR COVERS AND MUSIC IS GETTING SICKER AND SICKER, DO YOU THINK THAT YOU WILL EVER REACH THE POINT WHERE IT SIMPLY CAN NOT BE ANY SICKER?

Of course it can always be sicker, believe me! We change all the time because we used to enjoy the older stuff, lyrical wise. But now we are going for a much more sexual direction. But there are many more things to explore and explode... It is no problem for us to find really provoking stuff. It must be crazy! Interesting and crazy too. You will see, since we have got many ideas...

- SO YOU ARE NOT GOING TO RECORD A(NOTHER) PLAIN DEATH METAL RECORD?

It's too boring! We will change again and again. The songs will change, the lyrics, artwork, everything will change. We want to have a really unique style.

- I HAVE GOT ALL YOUR RECORDS, FROM YOUR DEBUT, THE SPLIT WITH DISHARMONIC ORCHESTRA TO YOUR NEW ONE, AND YOU HAVE ALWAYS BEEN A VERY EXTREME BAND IN MY EARS...

Yeah, and that has always been important to us. It must be extreme. It could happen that the next release also is in the more or less extreme sexual direction, but it will still be different. And extreme...

- SOMEONE TOLD ME THAT IT WAS ONE OF YOU GUYS' MOTHER ON THE COVER OF YOUR "DIRTY RHYMES AND PSYCHOTRONIC...." - HOW WOULD YOU FEEL IF IT WAS YOUR MOTHER ON THE COVER?

It's our bassplayer, Martin's mother. My mother would not do it. (I don't think my mother would either! -ed.). But Martin's mother like to do that sort of stuff

- WHAT DO YOUR PARENTS AND THE REST OF YOUR FAMILY THINK ABOUT YOUR COVERS AND STUFF LIKE THAT?

I don't have much contact to my family anymore. They know that I'm releasing records. They know our first, second and third release too, I think. But they have never seen the new one. But I'll give it to them, of course. Of course they will think I am sick and stupid, but they never appreciated what I did anyway, so I really don't care. That is basically the reason why I haven't got so much contact to them anymore.

- YOU KNOW, I SHOWED A FEW OF YOUR RECORDS TO MY FAMILY AND FRIENDS, AND THEY SAID THAT I WAS SICK, JUST BECAUSE I HAD THE RECORDS IN MY COLLECTION...


You should not buy the stuff then, he he. But I understand them. I understand parents who dislike the covers. But they are of a different generation, and they look at things different than we do. But I also know some elder people out there who appreciate our stuff.

- ARE THERE ANY SIMILARITIES BETWEEN YOU AND ANOTHER FAMOUS COMPOSER, WHO ALSO LIVED IN VIENNA? ARE YOU THE REINCARNATION OF THE LEGENDARY AMADEUS???

Well, he lived in Salzburg most of the time, but.. But he hasn't really got anything to do with our stuff. To be honest, I don't think I'm his reincarnation

IS AUSTRIA JOINING THE EUROPEAN UNION, AND IS THE E.U. BIG ENOUGH FOR PUNGENT STENCH?

If we do it will be in 1996. We will have an election then. I hope we will join it.. It's good to have easy borders, and it's good to have no fucking income-taxes, when you for instance get or send stuff to/from another country.




The exclusive "how To Treat And Repair Your hair" section

The SKIN(HEAD)-section:

Being a skinhead, the most important fact concerning the (lack of) hair-situation is to have a healthy scalp. That can be achieved by using the Australian Tea-Tree-Oil which has a healing effect. The Tea-Tree-Oil can either be massaged into the scalp or drunken (!). Please notice that it is important to read the instructions when you use the Tea-Tree-Oil. Malevolent Creation terrorized Copenhagen, and your faithful reporter was there....

- How do you feel at this very moment?

I feel tired, and a little relieved. Man, we finally got to take a shower after two days. We have been sitting in the airport, we missed the plane, we got totally fucked up. And after ten hours flight, and the bus-ride. We needed this shower!

- The weather here is quite a contrast to the weather in Florida, but have you noticed any other differences beside the weather?

Well, I haven't really had a chance to check out the surroundings yet. But from what I've seen this far, I like it very much.

- How would you compare your studiomaterial to a live situation? Is the intensity the same?

Live we tend to play the songs a little faster (!?!? -ed.), so we should be pretty fast tonight. We have been practising the stuff a lot, but unfortunately we will only play for one hour. But since we play the songs a little faster, we will be able to put 13-14 songs in the set, anyway. The songs we perform tonight are taken from all our three albums.

- How would you describe your music to someone who has never heard it before?

I guess I'll just say that we're aggressive, ha ha. And hateful of course.

- Has Bill Clinton ever heard your music?

No, but I'm sure that if he did, he wouldn't like it. I wish he would listen to it, though. Cool question, ha ha ha.

- Where did you get your bandname from? Don't you think it's a little childish?

I don't know.. Our name came from a "Transformers" cartoon, Brett (vocals) found it and he wrote a song called "Malevolent Creation". It had all the famous robots in it, because Brett was really into it.

- Does a Death Metal band necessarily has to have a brutal sounding name? Could a Death Metal band be called "Peace Flowers" for instance?

Ha ha, no I don't think so. We don't really think of our name as being brutal or anything...

- How is the scene in Florida right now? The latest bands I've heard are Eulogy, Apostasy and Astaroth.. Did I miss any? Fill me in then!

Yeah, there is a couple of good new bands. There is a band called Brutal Massofucation (Sounds killer! NOT!!!-ed.), but I don't think you-have heard of them. Then there is Raped Ape, whom you might have heard of. But they are not really Death Metal, they are more like a Thrash band. And there is also an all girl band down there called Demonomacy. They are alright, they are good friends of mine. I don't personally like their music that much, but you know, I have heard all male bands that are much worse. Eulogy is the best out of

the ones you mentioned. Also, Monstrosity have just put out a new demo.. They are not on Nuclear Blast Records anymore. They just gave us a demo before we left, and it sounds pretty fucking killer!

- Which was the last DEMO-tape that you bought?

The last demo I bought?? Jesus.. I haven't bought a demo in 4 years... I swear to God that I can't remember that. Nowadays I get them for free, ha ha. Hey, I think that I bought the Nokturnal demo (from New Jersey, I've got that one, too, he he.-ed.) back in 1990.

- Your next album: Another Morrissound recording, another Dan SeaGrave cover, another Roadrunner release, another Malevolent Creation release?

The new album, "Stillborn", wasn't recorded at Morrissound.. We're probably going to do the new album by the end of June. We will go to the same studio again, even though we weren't too happy about the production on the last one, it was a little fucked up. But it is a good studio, and it was kind of our own fault that the album ended up the way it did. We might bring Scott Burns down to that studio, but we don't know yet. By the way, we are NOT on Roadrunner Records anymore! The new album will probably be out on Metal Blade Records. We are trying to get on a bigger label, but we don't know what will happen. The new material is a little different. It is still fucking brutal and all that shit, but it is not so fast. The album will of course also have the fast stuff, but we'll shop the slower songs on to some big labels and hope that they will dig them. So when we will record the album, there will be 4 songs that aren't that fast, and 6 others which are fucking fast, ha ha ha. Metal Blade is a really cool label, and we tried to get on Metal Blade last year, but Roadrunner wouldn't let us go because they are fucking dickheads. We fucking hate that label, it sucks! Roadrunner were really cool to begin with, but then they started telling us that we should settle down and sound more like Sepultura.. No label is gonna tell us how we should sound, not even a major label!

- I saw some flyers for a new live-EP ...?


Well, it was actually a live tape with 6 songs on it. The sound is really good actually. It was recorded in Texas during our US-tour with Cannibal Corpse and Obituary. We actually record all the songs on this tour, and if some of them turn out really good, we might have Metal Blade releasing a live-album with us...

I've heard about Psycho, but I've never heard their stuff. I think I once heard Agathocles...
